

Whatever their age, please listen to your child read aloud to you, and enjoy talking about what they have read. Remember to sign their reading record, these are checked each day in school. Reading a story aloud to your child will also support them to hear stories they might not yet be able to read, it is also a really special family time.

Year 4 enjoyed an exciting and immersive History Day focused on Ancient Egypt. The day began with a virtual workshop from the British Museum, where pupils were introduced to some of the fascinating myths and stories from ancient Egyptian civilisation.

Back in the classroom, pupils brought history to life through a range of creative activities. They made their own teastained 'papyrus' paper and used it to write letters, imagining what it might have been like to be a scribe thousands of years ago. They also had the chance to design and create their own cartouches out of clay, carefully inscribing their names using authentic hieroglyphic symbols.

It was a day full of discovery, creativity and hands-on learning — a fantastic way to deepen their understanding of


life in Ancient Egypt!
