Buried Treasure.... *The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field, which a person finds and hides again, and out of joy goes and sells all that he has and buys that field. MATTHEW 13:44* As a teenager, I read this parable as a kind of real-life economics lesson. From that point of view, it only makes sense to buy the field if you are absolutely sure that the treasure is worth more than the field, right? But there's more to this story that meets the eye. It's not about real-estate investment. It's about making sure that the things we treasure have eternal - and not just fleeting - value.

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St. John XXIII Catholic School represents 150 years of Catholic Education dedicated to encouraging and developing well-rounded, self-confident and compassionate children and young adults who lead successful, mindful, service-driven lives. 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Did you know? A short history of St. John XXIII Catholic School.

In 1972, the three Catholic Schools in Middletown were consolidated to become St. John XXIII Catholic School. The three schools were St. Mary's School, St. John's School, and Holy Trinity School, each located in its respective church. St. Mary's School was turned into the East Campus and was assigned the lower grades, while St. John's School became the West Campus and was assigned the upper grades. In 2004, Bishop Fenwick High School constructed a new high school, and the St. John XXIII students moved into the former high school building, uniting all students in grades Kindergarten through Grade 8. As of 2019, the school boasted a 17-acre campus on Manchester Road, with a host of amenities. In 2009, St. John XXIII added state-accredited preschool classes for 3-, 4-, and 5-year-olds. The school buildings at St. John - the West Campus, and St. Mary - the East Campus, have been torn down. Part of Holy Trinity's old school building still stands. The Holy Trinity School traces its history back to 1867, when classes were first organized by the Holy Trinity Church, Father Boulger and the Sisters of Charity. The St. John's School traces its history back to 1880, when the Sisters of St. Francis of Oldenburg opened a school at the request of Father Leitner. In 1908, St. John built a new school building and, at times, offered high school classes. The St. Mary's School opened on September 2, 1952 in a single story building, and was operated by the Sisters of St. Francis. Construction in 1959 and 1967 saw the addition of a second floor used for new classrooms, and two basement rooms.

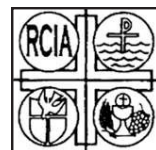
