First Reading - 1 Kings 19:11-13

The prophet Elijah lived about 800 years before Christ. Because he was loyal to God, he fell into disfavor with King Ahab and Queen Jezebel. He had to flee for his life to Mount Horeb (also known as Mount Sinai). As you listen to today's passage, it will be helpful to know that wind, earthquake, and fire were traditional Old Testament expressions of God's presence.

Second Reading - Romans 9:1-5

In chapters 9 to 11 of Paul's letter to the Romans, he addresses the painful question of why the majority of Jewish people failed to accept Christ. These were Paul's own people and he was personally hurt by this. He still loved his Jewish heritage and in today's passage he lists seven wonderful blessings that God's Old Testament people have received. He then adds an eighth: Christ the Messiah.

Small Church Communities... Over the past 20 years, Small Church Communities have helped keep our faith community connected through good times, through times without a pastor, and now these groups will keep us connected through any upcoming changes in our Family of Parishes. Small Church Communities include groups of 8-12 parishioners who meet at various times during the week from September to December and January to April.



Groups meet every other week at the parish, in member's homes or at Mt. Pleasant. The Fourth Watch...*During the fourth watch of the night, [Jesus] came to them walking on the sea. MATTHEW 14:25*

Jesus comes to his struggling apostles "during the fourth watch." That was the last watch from 3 a.m. to 6 a.m. And some say, the longest and most difficult watch of the night.

In other Scripture passages, God comes to people in silence, stillness and light. Think Elijah in the cave. But here Jesus comes to his panicky apostles amid deafening noise, total upheaval and utter darkness. He comes when the apostles' world is falling apart—they're exhausted and on the brink of death. Peter expresses their total desperation when, as he begins to sink into the sea, he cries out, "Lord, save me!" (See verse 30.) It is only when he grasps the outstretched hand of Jesus that the storm begins to subside and the apostles arrive safely with Jesus on the shore.

When we are battling mighty storms of desperation, let us cry out to Jesus and grasp his hand. For he is the Lord of all the watches of our life. **SR. MELANNIE SVOBODA, S.N.D.** Taken from *Living Faith Daily Catholic Devotions*

A child heading off to college for the first time is a milestone for the whole family and uncertainty, anxiety, excitement and worry are all completely normal feelings. Here is some good advice for parents navigating this momentous change for the first time.

- 1) Trust Yourself and Your Child.** You've done your best to prepare yourself and your child for this next stage of life. Now is the time to let your child figure it out and learn to be an adult.
- 2) Be There When They Stumble.** At the same time, be their safety net if they fail. Don't necessarily let them know you'll be there to catch them. Expect them to really need your help at some point, and be there for them when they do.
- 3) Help Them Be Their Best Selves.** Know that all majors readily lead to good jobs, and it's your son or daughter's responsibility to choose. Encourage your student to go "all in" on college and get the most out of the experience.
