

# COMMUNE WITH GOD



We live in a world defined by noise: notifications, demands, & constant updates. Yet, the deepest truth of our faith is found not in the clamor, but in the silence. Our heavenly Father desires an intimate, uninterrupted conversation with us.

If we want to lead lives of lasting impact, we must look to the ultimate example of Jesus Christ. His ministry was not nonstop activity but was a rhythmic cycle of work punctuated by deep spiritual withdrawal.

Jesus did not practice solitude because He was tired but because He was obediently dependent upon the Father. His practice establishes the blueprint for our own communion with God. We should seek the Lord in solitude like in Mark 1:35 "Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed."

When we intentionally create this space, two critical acts of communion occur. We hear God and worship God in new ways. Stopping the internal chatter allows us to hear the still, small voice that helps to direct our hearts and minds.

The celebrated spiritual theologian A.W. Tozer provides a challenging mirror to our distracted lives: "Listen for the inward Voice till you learn to recognize it. Stop trying to compete with others. Give yourself to God and then be what and who you are without regard to what others think." This solitude helps us to find the freedom to stop performing, comparing, and competing. It is an invitation to be molded by the Master's hands rather than the world's expectations.

This week, commit to carving out one single, uninterrupted block of silence and solitude. Turn off the phone, find a quiet place, and practice listening and worshipping. Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal the Father's will and restore your soul. May your time in the quiet place bring you closer to the heart of our Father than ever before.


