Mateus Rosé

Grape Variety: Baga, Rufete, Touriga Franca & Tinta Barroca

Region: Portugal

DID YOU KNOW?

Queen Elizabeth II once ordered a bottle of **Mateus Rosé** at the **Savoy Hotel** in London, surprising the staff with her choice – staff had to run out and buy some at local supermarkets. At the time, Mateus was seen as a casual, everyday wine – not something expected for royalty. After this, several other hotels stocked up on Mateus Rosé in case the Queen ever visited.

Domäne Wachau - Steinfeder

Grape Variety: Grüner Veltliner

Region: Wachau, Austria

DID YOU KNOW?

A nod to Austria's greatest composer, this crisp Grüner Veltliner hails from the Wachau region – an area Mozart would have known well during his travels between Salzburg and Vienna. Wine invoices from his household confirm that Mozart regularly purchased local wines, and it's likely that fresh, vibrant whites like this one were among his favorites.

Ten. Mormoraia – Ostrea

Grape Variety: Vernaccia

Region: San Gimignano, Tuscany, Italy

DID YOU KNOW?

Leonardo da Vinci spent time in Tuscany, where Vernaccia di San Gimignano was a prized local white wine at the time. While he's best known for his art and inventions, Leonardo was also deeply interested in winemaking and owned a vineyard near Milan.

Grape Variety: Muscat of Alexandria

Region: Malaga, Spain

DID YOU KNOW?

One of the oldest known grape varieties, Muscat of Alexandria was likely enjoyed by Cleopatra herself. Grown along the Nile and cherished for its floral character, this wine captures the opulence and allure of ancient Egypt. A fitting tribute to a queen who lived – and drank – boldly.

Region: Santorini, Greece

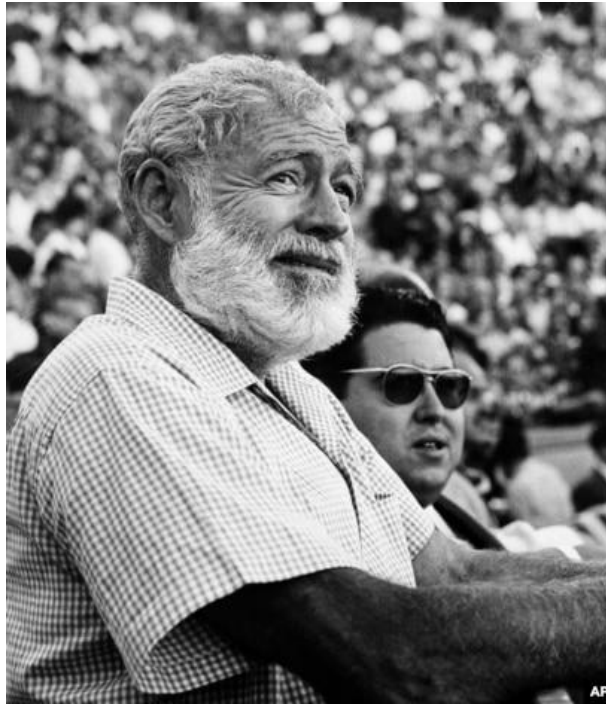

DID YOU KNOW?

Aristotle Onassis, the legendary Greek shipping magnate – one of the worlds richest during the 50's and 60's, who famously married Jackie Kennedy, was known for his extravagant lifestyle and refined tastes. Though he famously enjoyed the world's finest French wines, he never lost touch with his roots. Onassis valued the richness of Greek culture – and that extended to its wines.

Grape Variety: Tempranillo, Graciano & Mazuelo

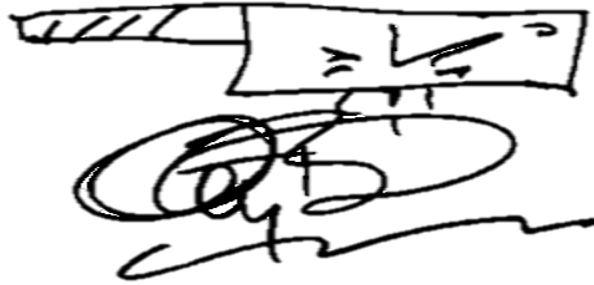
Region: Rioja, Spain

DID YOU KNOW?

Ernest Hemingway had a deep affection for Spain and its culture, especially the vibrant life surrounding bullfighting and local traditions. During his time in Spain, he frequently enjoyed traditional Spanish wines, which were often modest, everyday expressions rather than luxurious bottles. While he favored bold and authentic Rioja reds, the wines he drank were typically inexpensive and widely accessible, reflecting the rustic and spirited character of the region.

DID YOU KNOW?

Grape Variety: Malbec

Region: Jujuy, Argentina

Pope Francis, born in the heart of Buenos Aires, carried with him a deep respect for simplicity, tradition, and the spirit of community – values that echo in a glass of Argentine Malbec. While never indulgent, he has quietly appreciated the wine of his homeland, favoring it not for prestige but for what it represents: roots, humility, and shared meals.

Region: Marsannay, Burgundy, France

Williams & Humbert – Dry Sack

Grape Variety: Palomino & Pedro Ximenez

Region: Jerez, Spain

DID YOU KNOW?

In Shakespeare's day, sack – an early term for sherry – was one of the most popular drinks in England, imported from Spain and enjoyed across all levels of society. While the name has faded, the style lives on in wines like Dry Sack, a smooth, nutty sherry that echoes the character of the wines poured in Elizabethan taverns.

Royal Tokaji – 5 Puttonyos Aszú

Grape Variety: Furmint & Harslevelu

Region: Tokaj, Hungary

DID YOU KNOW?

Catherine the Great was the empress of Russia and reigned after overthrowing her own husband, she adored Tokaji Aszú, the famous Hungarian sweet wine. So prized was it at her Russian court that she reportedly stationed troops in the Tokaj region to protect the vineyards and ensure a steady supply. Her love helped cement Tokaji's reputation as a wine of luxury and royalty across Europe.
