BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

Facts about Breast Cancer:

- Breast Cancer is the 2nd leading cause of death in women. 30% will be diagnosed with breast cancer which is a disease in which malignant cancer cells form in the tissues of the breast. This cancer is broken into 2 basic categories referred to as noninvasive or invasive. Noninvasive cancer indicates it hasn't spread in adjacent tissues and is localized, but invasive cancer means they have spread into surrounding tissues.
- In 2023, an estimated 297,790 new cases of invasive breast cancer will be diagnosed in women in the U.S., and 55,720 new cases of non-invasive breast cancer.
- Of those women who are diagnosed with breast cancer, 64% will be diagnosed with noninvasive. The survival rate for noninvasive or localized breast cancer is 99% if caught early. Today are currently over 3.8 million breast cancer survivors in the United States.
- Half of all breast cancers occur in women with no specific risk factors other than gender and age while, 15% have a family member that has been diagnosed with breast cancer. Those who had a mother, sister, or daughter with breast cancer have a 30% greater risk of cancer. Of special note, breast cancer individuals have a four times risk of developing colon cancer.
- Of note to men, <u>1 in every 100 men</u> will also be diagnosed with breast cancer and in 2023 an

estimated 2,800 men will be diagnosed with invasive breast cancer. In every 8 women or 13% of women will be diagnosed with breast cancer in their lifetime.

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Most Important Facts:

- Women who receive regular screenings for breast cancer have a 26% lower breast cancer death rate than women who do not receive screenings.
- In recent years, advanced early detection and treatment methods have significantly increased breast cancer survival rates.
- In 2023, an estimated 530 U.S. men will die from breast cancer.
- In 2023, an estimated 43,700 women will die from breast cancer.

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
