

#### The Common Cup

Bishop Marianne Budde has indicated approval to resume sharing the consecrated wine from a common cup. If you wish to partake of the common cup, you are welcome to receive it. There is no pressure implied in this opportunity, because receiving holy communion in the form of either the bread or the wine constitutes a

full reception of the Body and Blood of Christ. The chalice minister will wipe the rim of the cup between communicants and using a silver chalice takes advantage of the antimicrobial properties of silver. Providing the people the opportunity to share the communion wine was an important part of the English Reformation (right up there with worshipping in the vernacular language of the people) so it feels significant to restore this option again. # The Daily Office of Evening Prayer

Monday - Thursday Each Week 5:30 p.m.

Join St. George's for the Daily Office of Evening Prayer held Monday through Thursday at 5:30.

The Daily Office is an ancient practice that uses daily prayers to mark the times of the day. For Anglicans, this generally comes in the form of the two main offices of Daily Morning Prayer and

Daily Evening Prayer.

The Purpose of the Daily Office: The sanctification of time – a reminder that all time is sacred since all time belongs to God and the sanctification of the individual – a way to draw a person closer to God.


