John 4:5


Today, the readings introduce us to the first symbol of Christian initiation: water. In the reading from Exodus, the people, freed from slavery and on their journey to freedom, protest against Moses because they are thirsty. The Gospel invites us to listen carefully to the dialogue between Jesus and the Samaritan woman. They meet in front of a well that will not fully satisfy anybody's thirst. As the narrative ensues, Jesus promises to satisfy the woman's thirst, and all who are thirsty, by offering her living water. The Samaritan woman, accustomed to drinking at the earthly well, has lived a life trapped in a dark past. Jesus frees the woman from her past by offering her water of eternal life. For catechumens, these readings become a great source of reflection, as they will soon be bathed in the waters of new life, baptism. For the assembly who participates in the first scrutiny of the elect today, these texts can help them renew their vocation as disciples of the Lord and servants of the Church.

First Reading Exodus 17:3-7 The Israelites grumbled against Moses for leading them out of Egypt. They were thirsty, and there was no water in the desert, so Moses struck a rock with his staff, and water flowed out for the people to drink.

Jesus met a Samaritan woman at the well. She offered him water from the well, and he, in turn, offered her the living water of eternal life. As a result, she and many others came to know that Jesus is the Savior.

Second Reading Ephesians 5:8 Live as children of light in goodness, justice, and truth. "Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light."

Gospel John 9:1

Jesus cured a man born blind. The Pharisees became upset because he did this on the Sabbath. After the Pharisees rejected the man's story, he met Jesus again. Jesus, "Son of Man," explained how the blind will see, but those who hold on to sin will remain in darkness.


