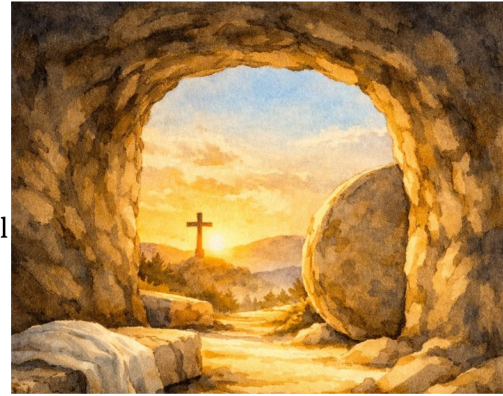

John 20:1-9

This is Easter Sunday, the day we not only celebrate the resurrection of the Lord, but, as Saint Paul reminds us in the second reading, the day we celebrate our own resurrection in Christ. Today's liturgy includes the renewal of our baptismal promises and the sprinkling of the newly blessed water from the previous night, indicating the impact that Christ's resurrection holds over His disciples. The narrative of Saint John's Gospel inspires us all to bear witness to the new, risen life that we share, much in the same way as the early Christians did in the book of Acts. Today, an effort must be made that the Easter Sequence is sung by all, or at least sung alternately between the choir and the assembly. If singing is not possible, it should at least be proclaimed by alternating groups in versus. Easter joy, displayed by music, flowers and other symbols, must elicit a spirit of fidelity and commitment from all participants, encouraging all to grow to be better disciples of the risen Lord. Those who coordinate the ministry of hospitality must pay special attention to welcome the many faithful who attend Mass today. The texts used for commentaries and the homily must also be carefully crafted to welcome those who desire the sacraments to enter the Church.

Readings ~ 04/05/2026 Easter Sunday

First Reading Acts 10:34a, 37-43

Peter preached about Jesus' baptism, the anointing with the Holy Spirit, works of kindness and healing, and his crucifixion and resurrection from the dead. All who believe in him are forgiven.

Responsorial Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23

Second Reading Colossians 3:1-4

Think about what is above. When Christ appears, then you shall appear with him in glory.

Gospel John 20:1-9

Mary Magdalene and the disciples went to the tomb and found it empty. They did not yet understand that Jesus would rise from the dead.

Early Christians adhered to apostolic teaching, centering their lives on prayer, the breaking of the bread, the common life, and charity.

Responsorial Psalm 118:2-4, 13-14, 22-24

Through God's great mercy, Christians have new life in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The goal of faith is salvation.

Gospel John 20:19-31 Through locked doors the risen Lord came, stood before the disciples, and said, "Peace be with you." Thomas was not present at first; when he saw Jesus, he could not believe. Jesus conquered his doubt.

Duration

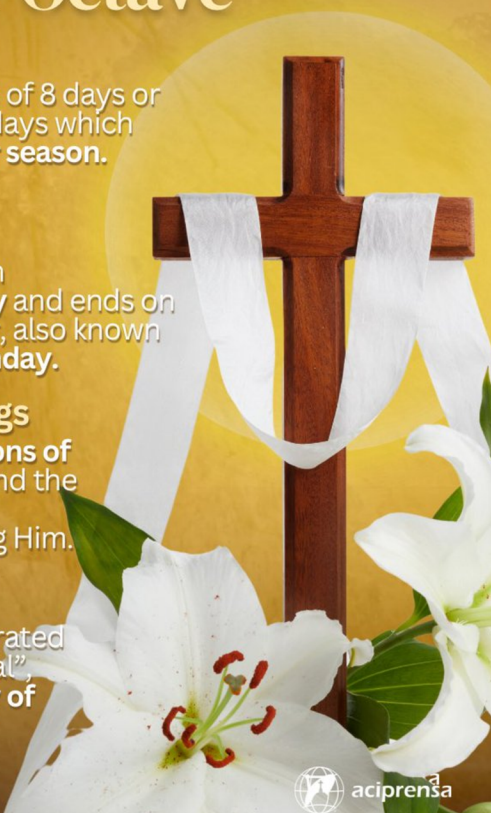
The octave begins on Resurrection Sunday and ends on the Sunday of Easter, also known as Divine Mercy Sunday.
