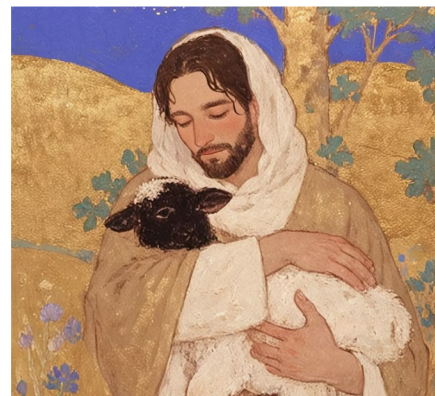

John 10:1-10

Today is known as Good Shepherd Sunday. While the first reading from Acts emphasizes the open testimony of Peter and the Eleven before a multitude of people willing to hear them, in the second reading, a letter sent later by Peter himself offers support and encouragement to Christians suffering persecution. In both cases, Christ is the gate between the living and the dying, the center of life for all who preach the good news. Christ is the voice of the Good Shepherd who takes care of his flock, he will not allow his sheep to be misled by the voices of robbers and prophets. We need to be faithful to the Church and proclaim the good news of our risen Lord as missionaries who extend their hands and hearts to all who look for Christ. As a family of faith in our communities, we should reflect on the following questions: What religious groups, Christian and non-Christian, are in our communities? Have we thought to start fraternal dialogue with these groups, as Pope Francis, our shepherd on earth, has taught us?

Bethlehem Wood Carving

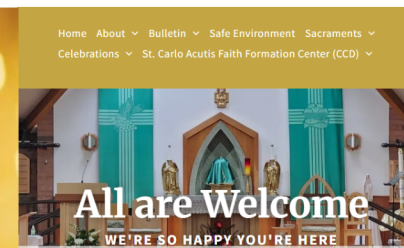
