Now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

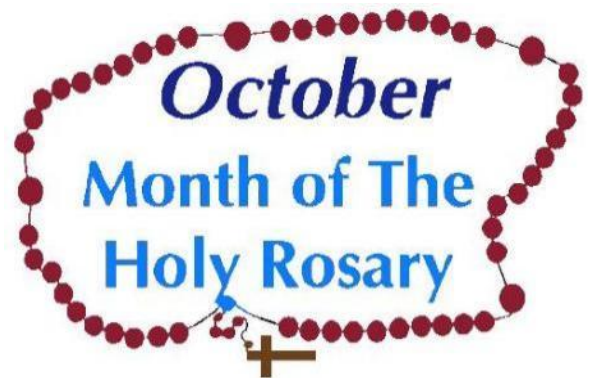

31 st October:	Rooms 3 and 13 will attend Mass.

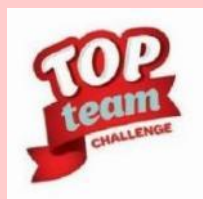

School Photo Orders

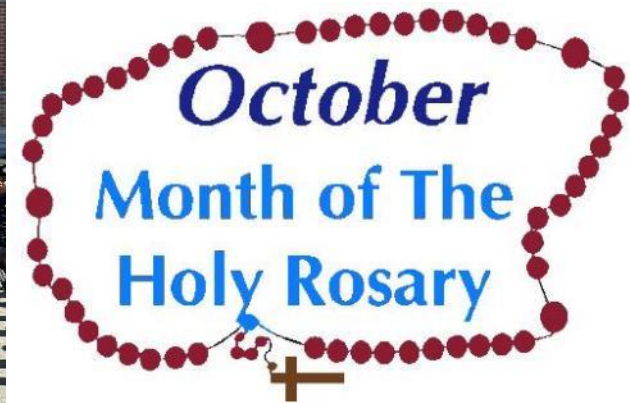
School photo order envelopes were sent home with students last week. If you are wanting to place an order, please complete them and return them to the School Office by Wednesday 22nd of October.

With the beginning of a new Term, it is a timely reminder to address student absences and lateness. We have had a number of students arriving at school after the bell (some as late as 9.40am).

Our school bell rings at 8.55am for the beginning of the school day. If your child arrives after this time, it is important that you notify the Office of your child's late arrival, as attendance data is recorded daily and sent to the Ministry of Education both for the morning and afternoon roles.
