Faith Facts - The Feast of the Assumption

This is the dogma (one of the essential beliefs of the Catholic faith) that the Blessed Virgin Mary was taken (assumed) body and soul into heaven at the end of her earthly life.

Mary's Assumption is a sharing in the Resurrection of her Son and an anticipation of the resurrection of others. The Assumption is celebrated as a Feast Day on 15th August.

Sacrament of Confirmation

The Confirmation Programme begins on Sunday, 14 September, with a combined parent/candidate meeting at St Thomas'. All those from Year 8 and above are eligible to be confirmed. Enrolment forms will be emailed to all eligible families and can be completed online. A parent information sheet about the programme will accompany the online form.

Paper forms will be available in St Thomas' Church foyer and Sacred Heart office. Enrolments need to be in before Wednesday, 10 September.

The young people will be confirmed on Saturday, 8 November at the 6.00pm Mass at St Thomas' Church.



Letter from the Attendance Dues Officer.

A detailed communication was sent to all parent accounts in early July, explaining the invoicing and payment process, including information about annual invoices, payments made, and upcoming statements.

At this stage, families have only received their annual invoice, and we are currently in the process of transferring and reconciling all payments made to schools, parishes, or the Diocese. Once this process is complete, parents will receive an updated statement showing both their invoice and payments made to date, followed by regular monthly statements going forward.

For a quicker response, you should include your full name, child's name and account number (if known). This ensures queries are handled promptly and avoids the need for schools or parishes to follow up on your behalf.


