

What is TACL?





Why was TACL Created?



The United States Government Accountability Office (GAO) published Public Transportation: Enhanced Federal Information Sharing on Coordination Could Improve Rural Transit Services in January 2020 (https://www.gao.gov/assets/710/703699.pdf).

GAO recommended that Federal Transit Administration (FTA) "develop a communication plan that will effectively share information with state and local stakeholders on coordination opportunities in an accessible and informative way."

This effort was created to improve interagency resource coordination between FTA and its five Technical Assistance (TA) Centers. TACL launched on January 13, 2021.

In 2022, GAO told FTA that their efforts satisfied the request.





Medical transportation is an important option for providing access to health care services for older adults and people with disabilities. According to the <u>Eldercare Locator</u> which connects older adults and caregivers to local support and resources, the top need for consumers is transportation assistance.

NADTC recognizes the importance of providing organizations and communities with the tools to understand how to manage and operate a medical transportation program whether starting or currently operating a program to better serve older adults, people with disabilities, weterans and low-income pooulations.




EV FACTS

- 3.6 million Americans miss medical appointments or delay care because they do not have access to proper transportation.
- 74% of calls to Eldercare Locator are individuals needing transportation to modical appointments.
- 13-14% of cancer patients experience transportation problems related to obtaining care
- 48% of older adults report "it can be challenging" to find rides to doctor's appointments

Coordination is the act of organizing federally funded transportation programs and sharing resources across agencies to improve the accessibility, availability, and efficiency of transportation services to targeted populations. Each resource is reviewed by 1) a task force member from a different TA Center and 2) 1-2 additional reviewers (a transportation expert and/or a member of the public with an interest in transportation coordination).






TACL eLearning Course


This course will introduce you to the TACL and walk you through how to use it to find transportation coordination resources.
