FR TRISTAN WRITES

"Bid the Lord welcome!" This is the phrase that I would recommend us to take as a bit of a spiritual motto for this Advent. Welcome is not a natural state of affairs for us. It means opening our hearts to others in a way that can leave us vulnerable. I have often been surprised when travelling in economically poorer regions to find how rich the welcome of people can be; when I was working in an orphanage in India, for example, it was humbling how often a family would invite me to eat with them, or to attend a wedding or family celebration: all with the sense that a guest confers honour (rather than merely inconvenience!) This Monday we celebrate the feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary - a feast which in some regard speaks of the welcoming nature of Our Lady, who gave of herself without counting the cost. The feast celebrates the dogma of the Church by which we believe that Mary - unlike us - was never marked by the stain of original sin even from the moment of her conception. It is difficult for us to comprehend, except through prayer, how this special grace would have come out deeply in her loving character, in her way of being. The Carmelite writer Fr Wilfrid Stinissen explains by making a comparison with other saints. "When Saint Therese of Lisieux writes that she never refused God anything from the time she was three years old, she means that she never said a conscious No to God. But in reality, Therese, without knowing it, often gave in to a certain self-centredness. Her conscious Yes could not have been without many small unconcious Nos. Mary's Yes, on the other hand, filled not only her consciousness, but her entire being. She was a living "Yes, Father" [...] [S]aying Yes was her life."

On that day: There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit. And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD. And his delight shall be in the fear of the LORD. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide disputes by what his ears hear, but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. Righteousness shall be the belt of his waist, and faithfulness the belt of his loins. The wolf shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the young goat, and the calf and the lion and the fattened calf together; and a little child shall lead them. The cow and the bear shall graze; their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox. The nursing child shall play over the hole of the cobra, and the weaned child shall put his hand on the adder's den. They shall not hurt or destroy in all my holy mountain; for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea.

In that day the root of Jesse, who shall stand as a signal for the peoples — of him shall the nations enquire, and his resting-place shall be glorious.

For I tell you that Christ became a servant to the circumcised to show God's truthfulness, in order to confirm the promises given to the patriarchs, and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written, 'Therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles, and sing to your name.'

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

GOSPEL (Matthew 3:1-12) The Lord be with you. And with your spirit. A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.' For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah when he said, 'The voice of one crying in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight." '

Now John wore a garment of camel's hair and a leather belt round his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region about the Jordan were going out to him, and they were baptised by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not presume to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our father", for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children for Abraham. Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees. Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

'I baptise you with water for repentance, but he who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into the barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'
