FR TRISTAN WRITES

Happy Feast! Today we celebrate 98 years since the consecration of our church. It's a wonderful moment to reflect on joy we have to encounter Jesus here in the sacraments here in Horsham, and give thanks for the lives that He has changed; to pray for the past - priests and people who served here who have gone to Him – as well as for the future....

There has also been so much written and discussed over the last few decades about the authentic renewal of 'how we do things' in the Church in 21st Century Britain and how we share the Gospel more effectively. But they all have one thing in common – an idea that comes straight from Jesus Himself: 'Apart from Me, you can do nothing' (Jn 15:5) Our parish should be a community of Prayer; of Formation to understand the Catholic Faith, the Scriptures, and know Jesus better; and Mission to preach the Good News to all, which reaches out to young people, to the sick, the poor... but we cannot anything without Christ! He describes Himself as the Vine in which we, the Branches, must remain to produce fruit.

For this reason, I would like us here at St John's to hold what I am naming a 'Eucharistic Forum' three times a year. **Our first** Forum will take place in two sessions on Friday 5th/ Saturday 6th December.

Everyone – no matter their age or background – is invited to our Forum. As the name suggest, it will begin with a period of worship before the Blessed Sacrament, where we will seek to genuinely listen to the voice of the Lord speaking to us. This will be followed by a forum for 'conversations in the Spirit' - not a 'talking shop' or 'town hall' style meeting, but a period of listening to one another in groups, and being heard: an act of worship and discernment. These 'conversations in the Spirit' are conducted in the 'synodal' style by which members of the faithful, lay and ordained, listen together to each other and seek a way forward together to discern the Father's will.

Each Eucharistic Forum will have a general theme. In this Advent season, and as our first ever Forum, it seems particularly appropriate that we will take the theme of "Welcome". In this season we remember how Mary, docile to the Spirit, on behalf of the whole of humanity, welcomed the Word of God with her loving "yes" and He took flesh in her womb. So we will reflect and pray as a community on how welcoming we are as a parish to all who pass the doors of the Church, yearning to receive Him.

The Eucharistic Forum will be organised by a new **Community Mission Group**, consisting of members who work together with me to look more broadly across the work of prayer, formation and mission in general in our parish, and to be points of contact and advocates to help co-ordinate our mission together. Each is a representative for a particular area of the parish Mission: Prayer & Liturgy, Formation, Evangelization, Family, Social Outreach (inc. The Covenant with the Poor), Community Life, and Communications - as well as a Chairperson. The members of the Group look forward to introducing themselves through our renewed Facebook page, in the new flyers and posters you will see, and will be around to meet you after Masses over the next few weeks, to welcome you to the first Forum.

As we begin another year in the life of St John's, a massive 'thank you' to everyone for being such a vibrant community. Let us continue to keep our faces turned towards Christ, as members of His Church.
