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Letter of Intent due with Complete Registration and Commitment

You are free to respond to God's call to live your faith more deeply—to worship, witness, and serve as a confirmed Roman Catholic. If you wish to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, write a letter to the Pastor stating your desire. The purpose of this letter is for the candidate to demonstrate in writing their desire to be Confirmed, and willingness to make this commitment.

Your letter should be addressed to your Pastor - Fr. Joseph Warner, Pastor, Blessed Trinity, Fr. Jared Orndorff, Pastor, St. Joseph, Fr. Dismas Byarugaba, A.J. Pastor, St. Anthony of Padua .

This letter should be typed and signed. Please use the following guide for the Letter:

First - Begin with your greeting.

Second - Introduce yourself and share some information about yourself, such as family, interests, and background.

Third - state that you would like to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation and explain in at least why you want to be confirmed. It may help to you to think about a) how this Sacrament will strengthen your relationship with Jesus, b) the role of your Catholic faith in your life, c) what it means to you to be a part of a parish community, d) how the Holy Spirit empowered the Apostles to be witnesses for Jesus (Read Acts of the Apostles 2:1-41), or e) what your expectations in receiving this sacrament are.

Fourth - Conclude the letter with a closing and your complete signature.
