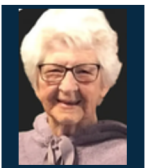

### **SECRETARY**

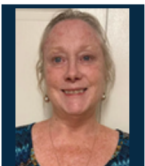

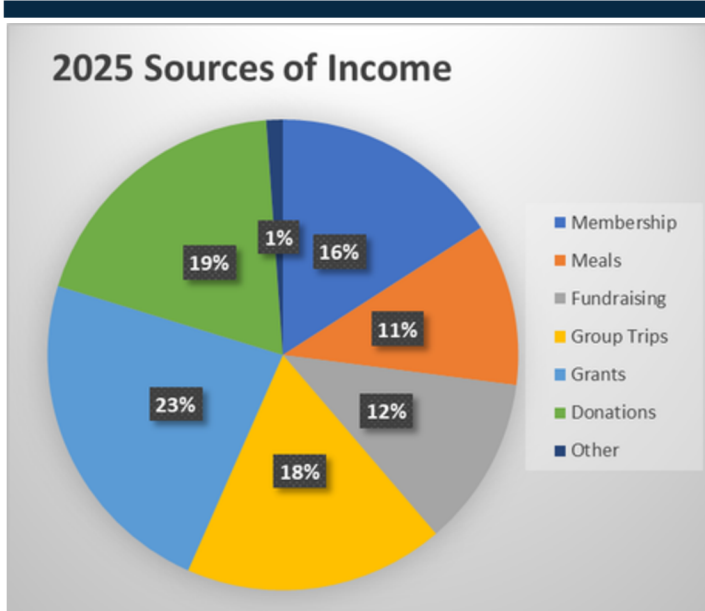

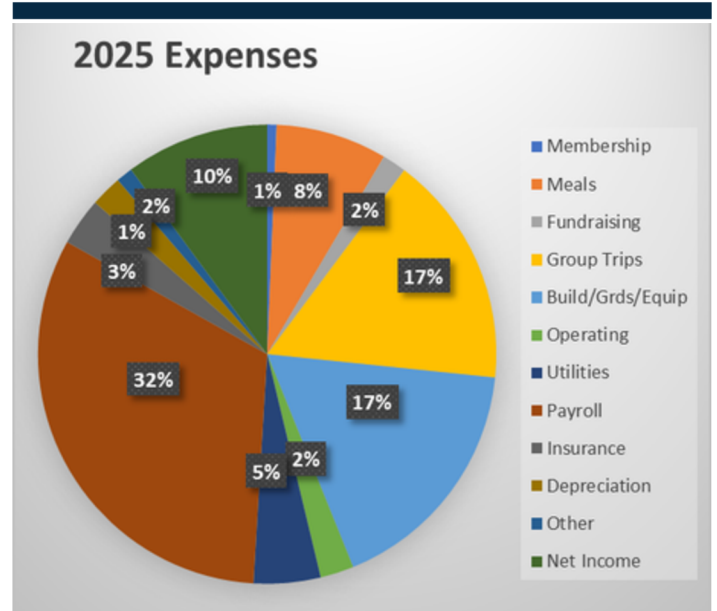

# Major Accomplishments

- Received a \$45,000 grant from the Town of Parker for parking lot repairs, addressing drainage issues, and floor jacking
- A feasibility study for determining future senior services was approved by the Town of Parker.
- Barrington Paint supplied paint and labor to paint the exterior of the Center
- Business Affiliate Program established by the Membership Committee
- Obtained State of Colorado Bingo and Raffle License with two game managers certified
- By-laws and Operations Manual updated by By-laws Committee
- PSC Newsletter and New Website moved to LPi reducing expenses by about \$7,800 annually
- Purchased new riding lawn mower in 2025 to reduce landscaping expenses in 2026 by \$4,000 annually
- Upgraded 2011 van to 2005 bus with more capacity and less mileage
- Black+Haus Wine Dinner & Silent Auction raised \$18,080
- Colorado Gives goal \$15,000 achieved \$14,988
- Increased Membership Total by more than 100 members
- First Time Event - Whimsical Wonders held in July raised \$4,527
