Fr. Jim DiVasto and Msgr. Marty Ryan will be celebrating this mass together.


Brunch at Boothe

TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In our Second Reading: Hebrew 12:1-4 the theme of running the good race is very strong

- We are encourage to keep our eye on the goal, the prize: Jesus.
- And we are urged to be strong, to endure no matter what.

Gospel reading: Luke 12:49-52 "I Have Come to Light a Fire on Earth!"

- This is a hard reading from Luke—in which we are told the Jesus has come to light a fire on earth!
- The fire is a symbol of the radical teachings about the Reign of God.
- This will divide families because it is a strong but difficult message for people to believe and follow.

Activity of the Week

Choose one of the following activities as a way to further reflect on the Sunday readings:

- Talk about the challenges which your family faces at this time? How can you work together to overcome those challenges?
- Hold a family picnic this week as summer vacation draws to an end or as our society gets ready to return to the regular activities of early autumn. On the picnic, hold a race—like the one suggested in today's second reading. Afterward, talk together about what it means to keep one's eye on the goal in a race.
- Name the people in your extended family who do not share your faith. Give them a phone call, not to recruit them but to let them know you care about them very much. https://lifelongcatechesis.osv.com




