#### The Unfairness of God



Jesus tells us today "when you hold a banquet invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you." Jesus illustrates with this teaching the reversal of human expectation in favor of God's abundant generosity. We live in the world of quid-pro-quo; we give x amount of money and receive x amount of return. Yet this is not how God loves us. Indeed, when we make mistakes, God's mercy pours out on us evermore. Jesus reminds us of this in his parables, as the prophets Jeremiah, Isaiah, and Ezekiel also do. God "gets us back" by loving us more. This is unfair and makes no sense to our standards. Perhaps the seeming unfairness of God's love overcomes the unfairness

# Fr. Jim's Installation Mass ~ Sunday, September 7, 2025

We invite all our parishioners to celebrate Fr. Jim's Installation as the 9th Pastor of the Church of the Holy Name of Jesus at the 10:00am Mass on Sunday, September 7th. Plan to arrive by 9:45am so you can be comfortably seated and enjoy the music program that will precede the beginning of Mass.

# Dear Holy Name of Jesus family,

I hope like me your excitement is building for my installation as your 9th Pastor just a week away! I shared with you last Sunday how during the Rite of Installation, I will renew the solemn promises that I made at my ordination to the priesthood: Obedience to Bishop Caggiano and his successors, to Preach the Gospel and Teach the Catholic faith, to Celebrate the Sacraments with reverence especially the Eucharist, to live a Celibate life for the sake of the Kingdom of God, and to Pray the Liturgy of the Hours.

Now, there are two other solemn acts I will make during the Rite of Installation. Together with you, I will profess the Creed, the Church's authentic expression of the essential beliefs of the Catholic faith which also serves to unify every community of Catholic believers (CCC 185-197). Then I will pledge the Oath of Fidelity. Now we all know the Creed, "I believe in One God, the Father Almighty...", but you probably only vaguely remember the Oath of Fidelity that Father Bert pledged at his installation.

Well, the Oath of Fidelity is a solemn declaration made by those who are called and accept a mandate from their bishop to teach or govern in the Catholic Church. It is an affirmation of their commitment to uphold the teachings of the Church and the authority of the Magisterium (the Pope and all bishops in communion with him). This oath is particularly relevant for bishops, priests, deacons, and other church leaders who are responsible for authentically passing on the Catholic faith to ensure that their teachings align with the doctrines of the Church (CCC 888-892).

And because the Oath of Fidelity is a solemn act, not just done publicly in the presence of the parish community by the one who pledges it and of the one who receives it for the bishop, that after my pledge Monsignor Kinnally and I will go to the altar. There each of us will sign the Oath. This is one of only few other solemn actions that take place on an altar in the Catholic Church apart from the Eucharist. For truly my pledge will be humbly made to and graciously received by not only Bishop Caggiano through Monsignor Kinnally before all of you, but by Jesus Christ Our Lord, the Church's Head and all of us His Body. Wow! So yeah, please continue to keep me in your prayers. I need them along with God's grace to do all this and more that Jesus has entrusted me to do to lovingly shepherd you.




WHAT IS QUARTER NIGHT???? For a \$5 admission fee you receive a "number" and we provide items for auction. The minimum

# Take The Word of God With You!

Theme—GIVE As GOD GIVES—in humility and love. In today's Gospel—Luke 14:1,7-14 we are presented with a scene with Jesus in the home of a Pharisee. Jesus addresses the guests with a parable that warns against self-exaltation. This lesson comes soon after the disciples were reprimanded by Jesus for vying for position. Jesus' words to the host point out that the kingdom is for everyone, and our hospitality is to embrace all, especially those who are overlooked.

Question for children: Jesus tells us that we should treat everyone as a guest. Who do you tend to shun or not be nice to?

Questions for youth: God asks us to do for others without hope of repayment. This past week, what did you do for someone else for which you won't be repaid? Who are the people most in need of your generosity?

Question for Adults: Who are the people living near you that you would find it most difficult to invite to a meal in your home? Or to invite to be part of your life?

# **Activity of the Week**

Invite someone to dinner who doesn't get out very much or who is alone. Remind the family that anyone who comes to your home is your guest and is to be welcomed as Jesus would be welcomed.




