



Fr. Jim's Column—Just One More Thing"!

Dear Parish Family,

I hope your beginning of this Advent has started off waiting well. This is a time to allow Jesus to prepare you and me for celebrating not only his birth, but his presence always among us, and his final coming in glory! I know many of you took one or all three prayer aids available last Sunday in the back of the church: Advent Star, Waiting Well with Fr Mike Schmitz journal, and the Magnificat Advent Companion. I hope these aids help each of you let Jesus come, be with, and in you, to allow him to do in you what he knows you and I need.



I hope too that you will open your heart to our Lord Jesus when he knocks that he may come in and dine with you. As you converse with the Lord in prayer and worship, do not let yourself be bothered by anything. Father Luke Dysinger, OSB, reminds us, "Do not be afraid of distractions. Memories or thoughts are simply parts of yourself that, when they rise up during Lectio Divina [prayer], are asking to be given to God along with the rest of your inner self."

Reverend George Matheson (1842-1906) was a minister of the Scottish Presbyterian church. A brilliant student, though nearly blind at 18, he graduated first in his class in classics, logic and philosophy at the Academy and University of Glasgow. One of his sisters learned Greek, Latin and Hebrew to help him through his theology studies and continued to help her brother with his pastoral responsibilities.

He was also a composer of church hymns. On the eve of his other sister's wedding, he composed the hymn O Love that will not let me go. Happy for his sister, but devastated that his finance broke off their engagement because he was now completely blind at just 20, Reverend Matheson gave it all to God and received a great gift in return. "Something happened to me, which was known only to myself, and which caused me the most severe mental suffering. The hymn was the fruit of that suffering. It was the quickest bit of work I ever did in my life. I had the impression rather of having it dictated to me by some inward voice than of working it out myself.

"O Love, O Love
O Love, that will not let me go
O Love, I rest my weary soul in thee
I give thee back the life I owe
That in thy ocean depths its flow
May richer, fuller be."

Reverend George Matheson's hymn has three more verses: light, joy and the cross. I encourage you to look up the lyrics and listen to a choral arrangement of it on YouTube. This too will help us wait well. Because this Advent, the Love that will not let any of us go, Jesus Christ, is waiting for you, for me.




