HOSPITALIZATION





This Week's Theme: **SEEING JESUS**

Breaking Open the Word: Step One: Listen to the Word-Gospel Mark 9:2-10

He was transfigured before their eyes! The story of Jesus' transfiguration is full of symbols. The images of cloud and mountain suggest God's appearance at the covenant-making on Mount Sinai. Moses, the major figure in Exodus and Sinai covenant represents the law and Elijah the great ninth-

century prophet of Israel, represents the prophets. Jesus is the fulfillment of the law and the prophets.....As you hear this familiar story today, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart?

Step Two: Look Into Your Life

Question for Adults:

In what ways does Jesus speak today, ways in which you can truly "listen to him?"

Question for Youth:

The disciples had a very intense experience of Jesus on the mountain. Have you ever had a "mountain top" experience? What was it like for you?

Question for Children:

Name or draw a picture of a time you knew that Jesus was with you.

CRS RICE BOWL FOR LENT




Jesus tells us, "I am the bread of life, whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." When we receive Jesus through the




