JANUARY ~ THE MONTH OF THE HOLY NAME OF JESUS

Although Saint Paul might claim credit for promoting devotion to the Holy Name because Paul wrote in Philippians that God the Father gave Christ Jesus "that name that is above every name" this devotion became popular because of 12th-century Cistercian monks and nuns but especially through the preaching of Saint Bernardine of Siena, a 15th-century Franciscan. Bernardine used devotion to the most holy name of Jesus as a way of overcoming bitter and often bloody class struggles and family rivalries or vendettas in Italian city-states St. Bernardine had inscribed the Christogram "IHS" - a combination of letters that represent the Holy Name of Jesus - and placed it on the background of a sun because there had been a resurgence in 15th Century Italy of sun worship, and to remind people that Christ was the Light of the World, the True Sun that never sets, and the Son of God.

Reflection

Jesus died and rose for the sake of all people. No one can trademark or copyright Jesus' name. Jesus is the Son of God and son of Mary. Everything that exists was created in and through the Son of God (see Colossians 1:15-20). The most holy name of Jesus is debased if any Christian uses it as justification for berating non-Christians. Jesus reminds us that because we are all related to him we are, therefore, all related to one another. www.franciscanmedia.org



Fr. Jim's Column—Just One More Thing!"

Dear Parish Family, I hope like me, you are feeling a little relieved but also sad that the Christmas season has come to an end today. Whether it was good times with family and friends, especially those we haven't been able to be with in a long time, or wrapping and unwrapping gifts, decorating the Christmas tree, or singing our favorite Christmas carols, doesn't it seem like this Christmas season came and went by so fast? Looking at the calendar, Ash Wednesday is just a little over a month away on February 18th. Yikes!



The Baptism of the Lord today gives us a path to begin with the treasures of God's love we each received this Christmas into this new year, this new liturgical year. We begin today with Jesus on the road from his childhood in Nazareth to the beginning of his adult public ministry. Gina Loehr, a Catholic mom and wife, who lives with her husband and children on a century old dairy farm in America's heartland, offers these important insights into today's feast.

"I love that the Church here encourages us to contemplate how the joys of Christmas mature and progress into public action and service. Will I move out of spiritual infancy and join Jesus in his ministry? I can carry Christmas with me . . . I can see the mission of my life as being, in a real way, the fruit of Christmas. My vocation as wife and mother is a gift I give to others as I am energized and inspired by what I received at Christmas – the gift of Christ himself."

Mrs. Loehr lives her vocation in communion with those Jesus has entrusted her to, her husband and their children. But she also lives her vocation in communion with her parish family, friends, and many others to whom Jesus has entrusted her that she not only may share with all of them how Jesus has revealed to her how her life's mission is the fruit of Christmas, but that all may share with Mrs. Loehr and one another how each of them have come to known their life's mission too is the fruit of Christmas.

So let us join Mrs. Loehr in our own individual life's mission that Jesus has entrusted to each one of us. We can't understand or do this alone. Living in communion with others too is part of the work of catechesis which the Neo Catechumenal Way will offer this January and February. Please consider coming to at least the first catechesis on Tuesday, January 13th 7:30pm to 8:30pm in Heritage Hall to learn more. Let us continue to pray for one another.


