PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

The Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd, commemorating the presentation of Jesus in the Temple, where an old man Simeon declared that Jesus would be "A light for revelation to the Gentiles and glory for your people Israel." Luke 2:32. BLESSING OF THROATS This weekend at all the Masses we will offer the Blessing of Throats. St. Blaise was a bishop and martyr who lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. For a time, Blaise lived in a cave to escape persecution. On his feast the church recalls a miracle cure associated with him and celebrates the blessing of the throats. Blaise apparently saved the

life of a boy who was choking on a fish bone. He is listed among the Fourteen Holy Helpers, saints revered as healers. He is the patron saint of throat illnesses, animals, wool combers, and wool trading. Crossed candles are an important part of Saint Blaise Day, they commemorate the mother of the boy who choked on the fishbone. She presented Saint Blaise with crossed candles to light his way to jail when the ruler of Sebastea ordered his arrest.

ANNOINTING OF THE SICK

"The compassion of the Samaritan: loving by bearing the pain of the other" is the theme chosen by Pope Leo XIV for the World Day of the Sick. The theme centers on the Gospel figure of the Samaritan, who demonstrates love by caring for the suffering man who fell in with robbers. It highlights a key dimension of love for one's neighbor: love must be expressed through concrete acts of closeness, by taking on the suffering of others — especially those who are ill, and often also vulnerable due to poverty, isolation, or loneliness.



The Solemn Celebration will take place in Chiclayo Peru where Leo XIV was a missionary beginning in 1985 and in 2015, he was named bishop of Chiclayo. Holy Name of Jesus also has a connection to Chiclayo Peru. In 1963, Father John Tomis, Assistant Pastor at Holy Name of Jesus Church followed Father John Hogan, Pastor of Our Lady of Peace Church to serve Bridgeport's Peruvian mission in the coastal city. The impact of Father Tomis was such that when he died in June 1986, after establishing a Faith Community, churches, schools and clinics—the schools closed, flags lowered to half mast, and 20,000 people attended his funeral.

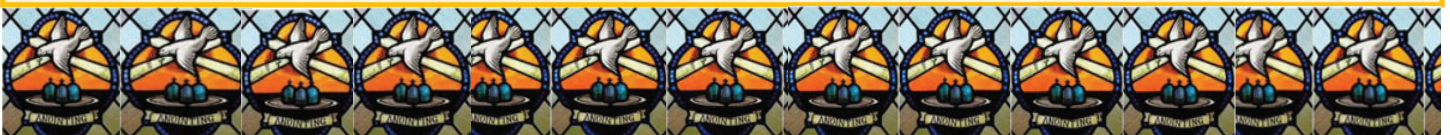
The Anointing of the Sick will be offered on February 7 at the 4:00pm Saturday Vigil Mass.

Who may be Anointed?

Baptized members of the Christian faithful who have reached the age of reason and who begin to be in danger due to sickness or old age may receive the sacrament of anointing. Participation in the rites is encouraged broadly. For example:

- The elderly who are weakened, even though no notable illness is present, may choose to participate in the ritual.
- Those who face surgery due to serious illness
- Those who suffer serious mental illness

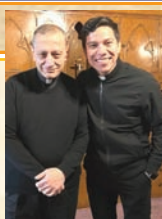

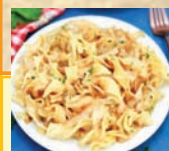

Fr. Jim's Column—Just One More Thing!



Dear Parish Family, there is lots for us to look forward to this week: the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus, the memorial of Saint Blais bishop and martyr, a Faith Event next Sunday February 8th, and the memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes on Wednesday, February 11th which is also observed in the Church as the World Day of the Sick. Please see the rest of the bulletin for more details.

The readings for today's Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time teach us that those who will be welcomed into eternal life in the Kingdom of Heaven will be those who lived their lives on earth with humility, justice, love, generosity, and peace. Jesus says the blessed ones are the humble and lowly, the faithful who pursue justice and who take refuge in the Lord (see Zephaniah 3:13). The humble only boast in the Lord Jesus and his salvation (see 1 Corinthians 1:31). And so it is fitting that since many of us will not be able to attend Mass on Monday, the Feast of the Presentation, or Tuesday, the memorial of Saint Blaise that I end all Masses this Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time with the blessing of candles and blessing of throats.

The Feast of the Presentation of the infant Jesus in the Temple of Jerusalem is celebrated throughout the Church as Candlemas. Candlemas because we bless candles that will be used in our church and at home throughout this year. When lit, these candles make present that Jesus is the "light of revelation to the Gentiles and glory for your people Israel." (Luke 2:32) Through Jesus' light, we help dispel the darkness in this world.

Saint Blaise was a bishop who was martyred. He was also a doctor who healed a boy choking on a fish bone. That is why Saint Blaise is invoked against illnesses of the throat, "Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat, and of every other illness."

Our next Faith Event in the Hall will be on Sunday, February 8th, just ten days before Ash Wednesday. On February 16th, President's Day, we will begin preparing for Lent with a Palm Burning Evening Prayer service in the church. The ash from the burnt palms will then be prepared to use on Ash Wednesday, February 18th. Because many parents and faith formation children will not be here on President's Day, I will also celebrate a palm burning service at our February 8th Faith Event.

Finally, at the 4pm Vigil Mass on Saturday, February 7th, I will also celebrate Anointing of the Sick. Please see and read carefully here in the bulletin who among us should receive anointing at this Mass. Anointing will happen immediately following my homily. Father Jim

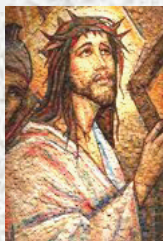

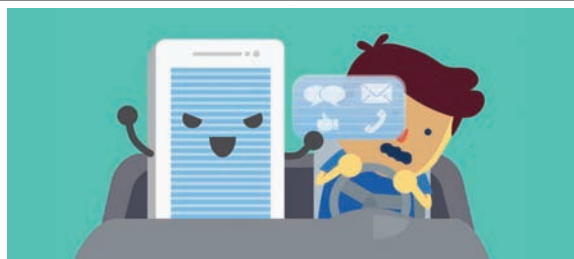

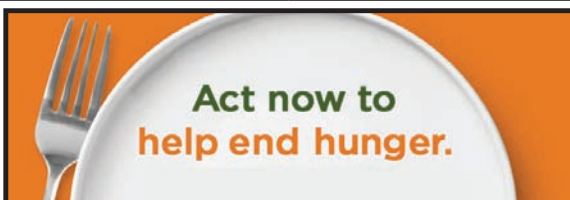
