Take The Word Of God With You As You Go! Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

WE ARE CALLED TO EVANGELIZE

The first thing that is striking about this gospel passage is the fact that there are 72 disciples whom Jesus sends out on mission. We can have an image of Jesus strolling around Galilee with just a small group of followers but this passage makes it clear that a significant number of people were engaged in his ministry. Another theme that is significant in the gospel of Luke is the message of hospitality. Jesus teaches on it frequently and tries to convey a message that the hospitality of God is available to all. In the sending out of both the twelve and the 72, Jesus tells them to take nothing with them for the journey. He is telling them to rely on the hospitality of strangers. This gospel is often used to make a point about the need for vocations to priestly and religious life. Jesus makes the comment that "the harvest is rich but the laborers are few." This image of laborers in the harvest is often applied to the work of priests and other religious vacations. However apt the image may be, when we read it in the context of the whole passage we can see that this sending out of the 72 was a general challenge to live out the call to discipleship—to go out in the world and bring about the kingdom.

Question for Children: How do you let others know about your faith?

Question for Youth:

Jesus sent the disciples out into the world, but told them that it wouldn't be an easy job. How have you shared your faith with others this past week? What were the risks for you?

Question for Adults:

To what part of the harvest are you being sent? What are you being called to do for the Reign of God?

We often are not sure how to read the prophets of the Old Testament, doubtful they can offer us much more than the news that the Messiah will one day come. But this is to miss the power of the prophets. Much of their writing is poetry, rich in metaphor and analogy that offer new ways of imagining God's loving presence in our confusing and complicated lives. The prophets and Psalmists tell us: God is like a mother, like a rock, like a shepherd, like a lover. May we mine the Scriptures and the prophets, always looking to discover the Lord in new ways and enter deeper into the mystery of His love.

Each month, thanks to your generosity, the Monthly Food Collection provides groceries to those in need, including Blessed Sacrament, Sterling House and our neighbors.

Dear Faithful, Generous Patrons, Supportive Pastors and Friends,

Because your generous donations have not decreased and we continue to receive, we continue to give! The only difference are the items being placed in empty bags and empty hands, and

the number of clients who have been visiting and returning. In past months, hackers have robbed many of our clients of their food stamp benefits and rent stipends. Two of our smaller local pantries have temporarily closed due to a lack of supplies. Add to this distress, the climbing price of eggs, and you can understand why we are now distributing close to 800 bags of groceries in only three hours on Thursday Morning. **But, the wonder of it all:**

WE ARE STILL ABLE TO DISTRIUBTE ALMOST 800 BAGS OF GROCERIES (and cookies and cakes), EVERY TIME WE OPEN OUR DOOR! THANK YOU! GOD GRACIOUSLY BLESS YOU! And because Bishop Caggiano and the diocese continue to offer us grant assistance, we are still here. And because workers are back to continue construction of our first neighborhood supermarket, and the hazardous waste dump, known as "Mt. Trashmore" will finally become the location for a UConn Hydroponic garden, and because a new pedestrian walkway will connect our neighborhood to nearby parks, we are hope-filled and assured of a joyful year and future.






