Our Parish Offertory Increase Campaign

I hope you all have had a chance to read and reflect on the highlights of my town hall meeting that I provided for you in last Sunday's bulletin. We have much to be proud of, and need to continue doing, to serve one another and our neighbors here in our parish and the Stratford community. I am especially grateful to all of you who have - and continue - to give generously and regularly of your time, treasure, and talent.

Because of you, we have been able to replace the Heritage Hall roof, improve outdoor lighting, and replace the church boiler as well as provide children and adults with faith formation, preparation and reception of baptism, Eucharist, and confirmation, not to mention, fun events like Family Bingo Night, Knights of Columbus Porchetta dinner, our Men's Society Car Show, and our Lady's Guild Christmas & Easter bake sales.

I know that you and I want to keep doing all this *and more* in the years ahead. For more than 100 years, our parish family has celebrated countless sacramental milestones of baptisms, confirmations, weddings, funerals, and everything in between. All of that continues, and will please God, continue for generations to come. All that is to say, *we together*, are part of the legacy of Holy Name of Jesus Parish. And together we are invited to prepare for the continued growth and progress of this parish family of faith.

Like each of you, our parish is not exempt from the rising costs of keeping our doors open with the lights on and the heat flowing. That's why I need you not only to contribute towards our \$45,000 Annual Collection goal, but also to thoughtfully and prayerfully consider if you can increase your weekly regular offertory gift now and going forward. Please consider a 15% increase in your weekly regular offertory gift. That would go a long way to meeting our weekly regular offertory need of \$5,102 and towards financial sustainability on our own.

Please know that I truly understand that some of you after thoughtful and prayerful consideration will need to cut back your weekly regular offertory gift. 




Waiting Well with Fr Mike Schmitz this Advent



'Oplatki' means "Angel Bread". Traditionally, on Christmas Eve, the wafer is broken and shared with the family members at the table. Generally the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing – whether it be good health, success, or happiness. The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is in that it shadows the Eucharistic meal at each Mass. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive Christ's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together and share the love they have for one another.


