

Remembering Who we Are



In today's second reading, St. Paul returns to a common theme and asks us, "Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" For St. Paul, the absolute basis and given of who we are as humans is that we are temples of the Holy Spirit. The language that St. Paul uses literally means that the Spirit "tabernacles" inside each of us. Yet there are all kinds of life circumstances that cover over our identity in Christ. In fact, much of our "sin" comes from our forgetting that simple fact: God is within us, we are not separate from God, and we do not need to strive for the wholeness Christ has already given us. May we look within...patiently, and with joyful hope, as we find who we are in Christ and who Christ is in us.



HIGHLIGHTS OF FR JIM'S TOWNHALL MEETING OF SUNDAY, OCTOBER 19TH

Just two weeks ago I held a town hall meeting in the church. First I gave an update on Faith Formation, Altar Servers, Extraordinary

Ministers of Holy Communion, Readers at Mass, the Seton Collaborative,
Confirmation with Bishop Caggiano, and the beginnings of a Regional
Youth Ministry among 4 of our Stratford Catholic parishes. I also
mentioned replacement of the church boiler beginning Monday,
November 3rd, as well as improvements recently completed, including
outdoor lighting at the Parish Office and Hall, the Hall ladies' restroom,
and a very minor repair to the Church sound system. Then I presented the
current financial status of our parish and the need to double current



monthly offertory giving so that our parish, all on its own, can become truly financially sustainable.

Here's what I covered.

Immediate Prior Fiscal Year 2024-2025

Total Offertory \$229,958 (52%) + Other Income \$212,182 (48%)

Total Income \$442.141
Total Expense \$485,472
2025 Shortfall \$85,959 (-17.7%)

2026 New Staff Positions \$46,704 2025 Shortfall \$85,959

Total Increase Needed \$132,664 = \$11,055/month or \$2551/week

Current Fiscal Year 2025-2026

Regular Monthly, Annual, and Diocesan Obligations and Unexpected Expenses. Investments & Earnings from the School Sale doing well over 4% Currently a monthly shortfall of \$8,000 to \$10,000

Our Path to Financial Sustainability

Where we stand today:

623 Registered Households,

1,183 people, but on Average only 210 attend Mass weekly

190 Chose Envelopes, but only about 55% actually use them each week.

Many others give regular financial support in Cash, about 20%

We need on average a Weekly Offertory of \$5,102

How can we reach this goal?

I will thank all who financially support our parish regularly, including our homebound.

I will encourage parishioners who do not regularly give financial support to do so.

We all need to invite fellow parishioners to attend Mass regularly.

We all need to invite others we know to join us for Mass at our parish.


