The Freedom to Love



Jesus tells us today, "if anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." We miss the heart of Jesus if we take these words literally, yet they are essential to discipleship. It is a temptation for us to focus on loving those close to us at the exclusion of loving all that God loves: our neighbors, our earth, even our enemies. In the Old Testament, Israel is blessed so that it may a blessing to all nations. Our close familial relationships are blessed in just this way: they are privileged places where we experience a taste of divine love. Yet as members of the Body of Christ, we also have obligations to others outside of our preferred circles. May we heed Christ's invitation to love widely, eternally growing closer to loving as Christ loves.

Dear Holy Name of Jesus family,

This Sunday during the Rite of Installation, I will renew the solemn promises that I made at my ordination to the priesthood: Obedience to Bishop Caggiano and his successors, to Preach the Gospel and Teach the Catholic faith, to Celebrate the Sacraments with reverence especially the Eucharist, to live a Celibate life for the sake of the Kingdom of God, and to Pray the Liturgy of the Hours.

Now, there are two other solemn acts I will make during the Rite of Installation. Together with you, I will profess the Creed, the Church's authentic expression of the essential beliefs of the Catholic faith which also serves to unify every community of Catholic believers (CCC 185-197). Then I will pledge the Oath of Fidelity. Now we all know the Creed, "I believe in One God, the Father Almighty...", but you probably only vaguely remember the Oath of Fidelity that Father Bert pledged at his installation.

Well, the Oath of Fidelity is a solemn declaration made by those who are called and accept a mandate from their bishop to teach or govern in the Catholic Church. It is an affirmation of their commitment to uphold the teachings of the Church and the authority of the Magisterium (the Pope and all bishops in communion with him). This oath is particularly relevant for bishops, priests, deacons, and other church leaders who are responsible for authentically passing on the Catholic faith to ensure that their teachings align with the doctrines of the Church (CCC 888-892).

And because the Oath of Fidelity is a solemn act, not just done publicly in the presence of the parish community by the one who pledges it and of the one who receives it for the bishop, that after my pledge Monsignor Kinnally and I will go to the altar. There each of us will sign the Oath. This is one of only few other solemn actions that take place on an altar in the Catholic Church apart from the Eucharist. For truly my pledge will be humbly made to and graciously received by not only Bishop Caggiano through Monsignor Kinnally before all of you, but by Jesus Christ Our Lord, the Church's Head and all of us His Body. Wow! So yeah, please continue to keep me in your prayers. I need them along with God's grace to do all this and more that Jesus has entrusted me to do to lovingly shepherd you.

September Feasts and Saints



The Feast of the Exaltation

of the Cross commemorates three major events relating to Jesus' Cross. The first event is the finding of the True Cross by St. Helena, the mother of Emperor Constantine. Tradition holds that St. Helena found three crosses, but could not determine which of the three crosses was the True Cross. A dying woman touched one of the crosses and was healed and thus this cross was determined to be the Cross

of our Lord. The second event celebrated today is the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in 335, built on the site of both Jesus' crucifixion and His empty tomb. The third event celebrated today is when the True Cross was returned to Jerusalem in 629 after it was stolen by the Persians in 614.

Reflection

The cross is today the universal image of Christian belief. Countless generations of artists have turned it into a thing of beauty to be carried in procession or worn as jewelry. To the eyes of the first Christians, it had no beauty. It stood outside too many city walls, decorated only with decaying corpses, as a threat to anyone who defied Rome's authority—including Christians who refused sacrifice to Roman gods. Although believers spoke of the cross as the instrument of salvation, it seldom appeared in Christian art unless disguised as an anchor or the Chi-Rho until after Constantine's edict of toleration. https://www.franciscanmedia.org

Sts. Andrew Kim Taegon, Paul Chong Hasang and Companions Feast Day, September 20

Christianity came to Korea in the late 16th century. By 1790, there were an estimated 4,000 Catholics in Korea who had never received the Eucharist or seen a priest. St. Andrew Kim Taegon was the first Korean-born priest. He attended a seminary in China and when he returned, he secretly helped Christian missionaries into the coun-



try. He was arrested and killed by the anti-Christian government for doing so. Paul Chong Hasang, a lay apostle, as well as several other Korean Catholics were killed for their faith in the latter half of the 19th century. In 1984, Pope St. John Paul II canonized over 100 Koreans and missionaries, including St. Andrew Kim Taegon, who were martyred between 1838 and 1867. www.catholicapostolatecenterfeastdays.org




