ABOUT SKYMONT

Skymont Scout Reservation is located on the Cumberland Plateau on the eastern edge of middle Tennessee. Our camp encompasses over 2200 acres with waterfalls, scenic overlooks, caves and wooded forest. The footprint of our camp allows us to get to know your Scouts while still providing extensive hiking and off-site opportunities for older members.

Skymont is a traditional Scout camp. Our staff provide quality merit badge instruction while introducing your Scouts to the outdoor classroom we know as Scouting. Our staff will welcome you into our family with fun, games, and delicious camp meals along with something for everyone. Our merit badge offerings include 11 Eagle-required options and 14 STEM-related merit badges. We offer all levels of programming. Our merit badge program runs Monday through Thursday, with Friday reserved for make-up time, special events, and camp-wide games.

ADVANCEMENT PHILOSOPHY

We are excited to offer over 50 unique merit badges and non-merit badge programs at Skymont Summer Camp!

Camp is a great place to earn multiple Merit Badges, especially badges that are difficult to earn - like range and target activities, climbing, swimming, kayaking, metalworking, and many others. Scouts should select merit badges that they find interesting. Leaders should be able to answer Scouts' questions about the requirements to help them in the decision process. The leader may also recommend or steer the Scout to work on some Eagle-required merit badges.

However, summer camp is more than just merit badges. For an entire week, Scouts will get to enjoy a one-of-a-kind experience only available at Skymont. Scouts will have the opportunity to participate in open programming in the evenings like swimming, boating, climbing, zipline, range activities, and more. Scouts may wish to participate in a service project, play 9-square or cornhole, or simply relax at the campsite. We strongly believe that it is important that Scouts keep a healthy balance of activities during the week. Lord Baden-Powell once said that "Scouting is a game with a purpose." We strive to make summer camp the most FUN experience for Scouts.

Skymont also offers several non-merit badge activity opportunities for Scouts ranging from first-year camper programs to special programs for older Scouts. Experienced campers can participate in challenging activities to further develop their skills. Beginner campers focus on activities that help them complete early advancement requirements and develop basic camping skills. Below is a list of some of our non-merit badge program opportunities.

- **POLARIS** (\$) Skymont's first-year camper program helps new Scouts with rank advancement requirements from Scout to First Class. Campers can earn their Totin' Chip and Firem'n Chit and practice basic Scouting and camping skills like knot-tying, fire building, first aid, and more.
- MILE SWIM Campers looking for a special nautical challenge will practice each day and build their endurance leading up to the final test the Mile Swim to earn this special award.
- COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING (\$) This program offers a fun and safe introduction for Scouts aged 14 and older to Cowboy Action Shooting. - a special shooting experience involving .22-caliber pistols, lever-action .22-caliber rifles, and double-barreled 20-gauge shotguns.
- CHAPLAIN'S AIDE PROGRAM Led by the Skymont Chaplain, Scouts will gain a clearer and deeper
 understanding of the twelfth point of the Scout Law and how to serve the needs of their unit and
 fellow Scouts. Scouts will learn how to plan and lead a non-denominational service and assist with
 the weekly Vespers on Thursday night at Lightfoot Chapel. Scouts who complete the program are
 recognized with a special Chaplain's Aide patch.
- PAUL BUNYAN AWARD Over several evening sessions, Scouts will learn and improve their
 woodsmanship skills in the use of a variety of woods tools and will put that knowledge to the test
 performing trail maintenance or a conservation project around camp.
- OPEN PROGRAM Evenings at Skymont offer Scouts the opportunity to spend some free time at the range, on the climbing tower and zipline, or at the aquatics area for swimming and boating. No stress, no pressure, just FUN!
