The ONE Awards celebrate the outstanding individuals whose dedication and volunteer efforts make netball possible. This year's event featured twelve national ONE Awards, alongside several Pass On Your Passion and Long Service Awards, as well as the presentation of a new Honorary Life Membership Award.

The prestigious event saw over 230 guests gather and celebrate the contributions and achievements of some of England Netball's amazing volunteers. England Netball Chair Baroness Sue Campbell welcomed guests before stars of the game such as England Netball President Eboni Usoro-Brown, Birmingham Panthers Head Coach Sonia Mkoloma, Vitality Rose Fran Williams and Future Roses Hannah Knightbridge, Sophie Egbaran and Izzi Phillips presented the 12 national ONE Awards.

### **Long Service Award: Caroline Richards**

Caroline Richards was the recipient of a prestigious Long Service Award. The award is given to individuals who have contributed 25 years of service at county, regional, national and international level, dedicating significant time across varying roles to improve the lives of netballers around them.

As a long standing member of Derbyshire Netball's CMB and as a Committee member before the reorganisation of Derbyshire's administration, Caroline has given exceptional

service to a number of roles but predominately as Treasurer since 1995 and as Competition TSG Lead and representative on the Regional TSG since 2008. Other roles which Caroline dedicates her skills and time to are as a County Squad umpire until 2005, currently a member of Derbyshire's Governance and Finance group, County Secretary from 2003 to 2008 and part of the Archive Group in 2022.

Caroline is a member of Stiletto Netball Club and has been a valued player, attained her Level 1 Coaching Award and 'B' Umpiring Award to support the club. Her skills and enthusiasm guided and contributed to Stiletto for more than 40 years before she reluctantly hung up her trainers.

Caroline is highly regarded in Derbyshire; not only for the dedication and commitment which she gives to each role or task, but as a voice of reason who will always listen to and consider everyone's opinion or rationale before voicing her own measured responses.

Derbyshire Netball is proud and pleased that Caroline has received her EN Long Service Award – so richly deserved.

# Outstanding Contribution of the Year (in memory of Mary Bullock): Claire Bowen

The first of our remarkable national winners was Claire Bowen. Claire stands at the very core of Bingham Bullettes Netball Club and her passion, kindness and unwavering commitments have grown the club into an inclusive community for over 200 players, aged five to seventy-five.

Claire acts as a coach, mentor and leader and adapts to every need, ensuring that neither cost or confidence ever stops anyone from participating.



Whether providing subsidised or free kit, or offering alternative options for those who prefer not to wear a dress, she creates space for everyone to feel welcome. Her joy has made impact way beyond the netball courts and she has changed lives through belief and encouragement.

Claire has also supported local primary and secondary schools, expanding access to netball and creating greater opportunities for young people. She has forged links with local Rainbows groups, offering taster Bee Netball sessions that introduce the sport in a fun and welcoming way. Bee Netball has flourished at Bingham, with this section of the club operating at full capacity for the past two seasons.



### **Inclusion Award: Linda Ryan**

Our second exceptional winner was Linda Ryan. Linda implemented innovative training ideas to transform access to netball for the deaf community. Equipment such as vibrating buzz balls and light-based umpiring systems broke barriers and revolutionised the game for the deaf community.

Linda showed incredible leadership and

determination through her collaborative work with Deaf Sport UK, local partners, and national organisations. This work empowered the deaf community, created new opportunities and created a lasting impact both on and off the court.

As a driving force in creating more netball opportunities for the Deaf community, Linda has played a pivotal role in expanding opportunities within the sport. Through her compassionate and inclusive leadership, she has fostered a strong sense of belonging, connection, and aspiration within a group that had previously been underrepresented in netball.

### **Unsung Hero: Angela Stevens**

Our next fabulous ONE Award winner was Angela Stevens. Angela is the full embodiment of an unsung hero, working tirelessly behind the scenes, expecting nothing, yet giving everything. As Secretary of the North West Leicestershire Netball League, she has been a driving force behind its remarkable expansion - from just 6 teams to an impressive 36. Through her dedication to improving infrastructure, streamlining administration, and fostering a professional yet welcoming environment, Angela has helped reshape local league netball and set new standards for the sport in the community.

### **NETBALL WORLD YOUTH CUP**

The 2025 Netball World Youth Cup (NWYC) was held in Gibraltar this September. There was 57 games over nine days of competition and the East Midlands had plenty of representation.

### **England U21s Claim Bronze in Gibraltar**

England's U21 squad delivered an impressive performance at the recent competition in Gibraltar, with Nottingham Forest's <u>Jayda Pechová</u> and <u>Anya Williams</u>, alongside <u>Celena Appleby-Prince</u> of Loughborough Lightning, all featuring in the 12-strong travelling team.

After a delayed start to their campaign - caused by Sri Lanka forfeiting their opening fixture - England hit the ground running, opening with a commanding 65–28 victory over Wales. Two further wins saw them top Group C and advance confidently to the quarter-finals.

There, they faced Scotland and showcased their defensive dominance with a convincing 64–33 win, securing a place in the semi-finals against New Zealand U21s.

The semi-final proved to be a thrilling encounter. Despite New Zealand taking an early lead, England mounted a spirited comeback, reducing an 11-goal deficit to just two following a series of impactful changes. However, time ran out for the young Roses, who narrowly fell <u>49–51</u> in a valiant effort.

Less than 24 hours later, England returned to court determined to claim bronze. Facing a strong South Africa side, they quickly found rhythm and maintained their composure throughout. A steady, confident performance saw them seal a <u>55–35</u> victory and a well-deserved <u>bronze medal finish</u>.

### **SOLUTION ALITY NETBALL INTERNATIONAL SERIES**

The recent Vitality Netball International Series saw the Vitality Roses take on New Zealand's Silver Ferns in a compelling three-match showdown. The opening two games, held at the Copper Box Arena in London on 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> November, saw England suffer a narrow 58-61 defeat before bouncing back with a spirited and composed 61-58 victory in the second test. The series finale, held at the AO Arena in Manchester on 19<sup>th</sup> November was taken by the Silver Ferns who, after a closely contested first three quarters, ended the game 55-49.

While the final result didn't go England's way, there was plenty to celebrate in terms of performance and development. The series saw exciting new talent as Jas Brown made her international debut, bringing fresh energy to the Roses' line-up. Meanwhile, Sasha Glasgow and Eleanor Cardwell made a welcome return to the international stage for the first time since injury.

The East Midlands was proud to be well represented by Loughborough Lightning as part of this series. Beth Cobden reached a major milestone, celebrating her 50th cap for England - a testament to her enduring class, dedication, and leadership on court.

Their performances highlighted the depth of netball talent in our region and offered plenty of inspiration for the next generation.

### **WARRIORS EMBARK ON A NEW CHAPTER IN PREMIER LEAGUE 2**

After three successful seasons competing in England Netball's National Premier League 1, Charnwood Rutland Warriors begin a new chapter in Premier League 2. The Premier League showcases some of the best netball talent in the country, with teams travelling the length and breadth of England to compete at the highest level.



With several Warriors players earning opportunities in the Super League for the 2025–2026 season, the time was right for a rebuild. This season, the Warriors' focus is firmly on developing the next generation of talent nurturing players from age 15 upwards through competitive play against seasoned Premier League opponents.

While Jasmine Brown continues her commitments on the international stage, she remains a vital influence in developing the Warriors' talented junior defenders.

The Warriors have enjoyed a steady first half of the season, sitting mid-table and recording an unprecedented number of draws, a reflection of the competitive nature of the league and the team's growing resilience.

# Back in Action: New Season, New Signings, and a Familiar Return!


