

ASHBY NETBALL CLUB BREAKING RECORDS FOR CHARITY!



The Ashby Netball Club has pulled off a truly spectacular feat, combining record-breaking achievements with an awe-inspiring act of charity that has captured hearts far and wide. Their recent Ashby Netball Marathon not only saw players endure a jaw-dropping 75 hours of continuous play, but it also led to the smashing of three Guinness World Records and raising over £57,000 for charity!

Determined to leave a lasting impact, multiple teams took on the challenge of breaking the World Record for the most goals scored in 60 minutes and the most goals scored in 3 minutes. The previous record of 1105 goals in an hour, set by Trinity Netball Club in 2021, was absolutely shattered when one of Ashby's teams netted an incredible 1564 goals in just 60 minutes! If that wasn't enough, the club also set a brand-new record for the most goals scored in 3 minutes, hitting an impressive 97 goals. A standout moment of the marathon came when Imogen Talbot took to the court with a singular mission – to beat the individual record for most goals scored in one minute. The record of 40 goals was held by Suzanne Hobson in North Yorkshire, but Imogen's lightning-fast shooting saw her land a whopping 49 goals in just 60 seconds! That's a goal every 1.25 seconds, an astonishing feat of skill and endurance.

This incredible effort was more than just a show of athletic excellence. The 75-hour netball marathon was all in the name of charity, with funds raised set to make a real difference in the community. Over an astounding £57,000 was raised for Kids Village, a charity dedicated to providing free, life-enhancing respite holidays for critically ill children and their families.

Kids Village is on a mission to build a unique holiday village in the heart of the UK, near Lichfield, Staffordshire. Their goal is to create a safe and supportive environment where families can escape the pressures of daily life, find joy in magical moments, and make lasting memories together. With no cost to the families, this initiative offers a much-needed break from the stress and challenges of ongoing treatments and hospital visits, providing a space of relaxation and happiness. This charity is close to the hearts of the club as Carla Garey (their Club Development Lead) made a pledge to fundraise after seeing her inspirational little girl Evelyn, fight for her life after being born with a rare congenital condition causing a defect of her RET gene and one of the resulting factors was a condition called Hirschsprung's Disease; the amazing players at Ashby Netball stood up and wanted to help. BRIGG CELEBRATE 25 YEARS!

Brigg Netball Club celebrated it's 25th Anniversary on Friday 28th March 2025 with a 'Net' Ball at Hemswell Court, Lincolnshire.

Current Head Coach, Vanessa McErlain-Naylor, also the Club's founder, has been at the helm ever since. The Club was set up following requests from the girls who had attended the primary school after-school club (which she ran to support her son's school), who wanted to keep playing together when they moved on to Year 7.

With support from husband, Mark, the Club became a reality and what a success it has been!! The club has seen a number of past and present, NPL and junior international players wear a Brigg dress as part of their netball journey (including a current senior international USA player).

The Club has also been successful in starting numerous coaches and umpires off on their respective paths, including Vanessa's son Stuart (Superleague umpire). In 2012 Brigg was voted the England Netball 'Club of the Year' at the National Goalden Globes (now called ONE Awards).

The Club is a wonderful friendly place to be, with a great family feel, one which the girls are reluctant to leave and many return there post university.

The toast to Brigg Netball Club was proposed on the evening by Meg Chapman, current senior player and one of the original players 25 years ago!

BREAKING BOUNDARIES: CHAMPIONING MEN'S AND MIXED NETBALL IN LINCOLNSHIRE



In a sport traditionally dominated by women, one Lincolnshire netballer is breaking new ground.... this time by opening up the court to men's netball. A long-standing ambition to introduce men's netball finally became a reality in late 2024, thanks to the vision and determination of a local female player, coach, and umpire - Emily.

Her inspiration reignited after attending the National Mixed Netball Finals in Loughborough, where teams from across the UK showcased the speed, skill and teamwork of mixed play. Soon after, she passed her B Award umpiring assessment, which bolstered her drive to take action locally.

The real turning point came in October 2024, when a parent from her home club, Louth Netball Club, expressed a shared enthusiasm for starting a men's session. Wasting no time, the first official men's netball session launched the following month, drawing in eight male participants from varied backgrounds. Their quick progress and passion for the game were clear—and by December, they'd already played (and won!) their first mixed match.

Not one to rest on early success, she continued coaching and growing the group, watching with pride as the men returned in February 2025 for a second victorious match. Sessions have since evolved into a regular mixed offering, carefully structured to prioritise the men's development while fostering an inclusive environment. With another mixed tournament on the horizon this May in Grimsby, this grassroots effort is gathering real momentum! We look forward to seeing Emily and the team progress and build up Mens Netball sessions in Louth!








MILESTONE ACHEIVEMENTS


