Our Mission - We, as members of Our Lady of the Desert Church, through the guidance of our Blessed Mother Mary, are a community of believers in Jesus Christ, from whom we have the mission of making His Gospel alive in our parish and in the world. By living out His Gospel, we help to shape a society with greater respect for human life, economic and environmental justice, cultural diversity, and global solidarity, so that we will build a church where everyone feels welcome and through it will find happiness and salvation.

Jesus says that the poor in spirit, those who mourn, the meek and gentle, the hungry and thirsty for justice and even those who are persecuted for His sake will be blessed. But what is blessed about being poor in anything? What is blessed about meek and gentle...or insulted and persecuted and have every kind of evil uttered against you? Rejoice and be glad? You've got to be kidding!

But God isn't kidding. What these readings are asking for, is just one thing: that we find true happiness by following in the footsteps of Jesus Christ.

Jesus was poor: he was born in a manger and died with nothing on the cross. And, He was poor in spirit because He depended completely on God. What about you? Jesus was meek, gentle and merciful in the way he dealt with the young and old, sick and suffering, and anyone in need. He sought out the suffering, the rejected, the despised, the prostitutes, tax collectors, the lepers and every kind of sinner. What about you?

Jesus hungered for justice when he condemned the scribes and Pharisees for their hypocrisy. Jesus mourned and wept over unrepentant Jerusalem and his heart was always heavy for every sinner. What about you? And Jesus was persecuted and crucified for the sake of righteousness because He would not compromise His mission of love and mercy for God. Are we willing to do that?

What Jesus is saying is this: you will be happy if your life reflects the love and goodness of my Father. You will be happy if you serve your fellow human beings in my name. And, you will be happy if you endure difficulties, confusion, disappointments, conflict and exhaustion in serving me and my brothers and sisters. This is the only way you will be truly happy in this world and in the world to come.

This is the true joy which pain, sorrow, grief, loss, and even death itself cannot take away from us.

Look. Jesus didn't promise us a rose garden. He promised us a life of challenge but also the strength of His Spirit to meet those challenges. He promised us a life of difficulties, but He also said: Whatever you ask in my name, I will do (Jn 14:13).

He promised us a life of conflict, but love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father (Mt 5:44-45). He promised us a life of sacrifice and exhaustion, but also a life in which we will find strength and love from a Father who loves us with an everlasting love.

What Jesus is asking of you, is that you find true happiness by living with His wisdom, His righteousness, His holiness and His mercy when he forgives your sins (1 Cor 1:30). How? By following Jesus Christ—in His footsteps—through the cross to the resurrection and forever with Him in heaven!

Jesús dice que los pobres en espíritu, los que lloran, los sufridos, los que tienen hambre y sed de justicia, y hasta los que son perseguidos por Su causa serán bendecidos. Pero, ¿qué hay de bendiciones en ser pobre en algo?

¿Qué hay de bendiciones en los sufridos y mansos... o en los insultados y perseguidos y en los que se habla cosas falsas contra ellos? ¿Alégrese y salten de contento?

¡Tiene que ser broma!

Pero Dios no está bromeando. Lo que piden estas lecturas es solo una cosa: que encontremos la verdadera felicidad siguiendo los pasos de Jesucristo. Jesús fue pobre: nació en un pesebre y murió sin nada en la cruz. Y era pobre de espíritu porque dependía completamente de Dios. ¿Qué de tú? Jesús fue manso, tierno y misericordioso en su trato con los jóvenes y los ancianos, los enfermos y los que sufrían, y con todos los necesitados. Buscó a los que sufrían, a los rechazados, a los despreciados, a las prostitutas, a los que cobraban impuestos, a los leprosos y todo tipo de pecador. ¿Qué de tú?

Jesús tenía hambre de justicia cuando condenó a los escribas y fariseos por su hipocresía. Jesús se lamentó y lloró por Jerusalén y su corazón siempre estaba apesadumbrado por cualquier pecador. ¿Qué de tú? Y Jesús fue perseguido y crucificado por causa de la justicia porque no quiso comprometer Su misión de amor y misericordia, para Dios. ¿Estamos dispuestos a hacer eso?

Lo que Jesús está diciendo es esto: serás feliz si tu vida refleja el amor y la bondad de mi Padre. Serás feliz si sirves a tus semejantes en mi nombre. Y serás feliz si aguantas las dificultades, la confusión, las desilusiones, los conflictos y el agotamiento al servirme a mí ya mis hermanos y hermanas. Esta es la única manera en que serás verdaderamente feliz en este mundo y en el mundo que viene.

Esta es la verdadera alegría que el dolor, el sufrimiento, la pena, la pérdida y hasta a mera muerte no nos pueden quitar.

Mira. Jesús no nos prometió un jardín de rosas. Él nos prometió una vida de desafíos, pero también la fuerza de Su Espíritu para enfrentar esos desafíos. Nos prometió una vida de dificultades, pero también dijo: cualquier cosa que pidan en mi nombre, lo haré (Jn 14:13).

Él nos prometió una vida de conflicto, pero amen a sus enemigos y oren por quienes los persiguen. Así serán dignos hijos de su Padre del cielo (Mt 5:44-45). Nos prometió una vida de sacrificio y agotamiento, pero también una vida donde vamos a encontrar la fuerza y el amor de un Padre que nos ama con un amor eterno. Lo que Jesús te está pidiendo es que encuentres la verdadera felicidad viviendo con Su sabiduría, Su justicia, Su santidad y Su misericordia cuando Él perdona tus pecados (1 Cor 1:30). ¿Cómo? Siguiéndolo a Jesucristo—en sus huellas— a través de la cruz hasta la resurrección, y para siempre con Él en el cielo!

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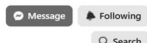
