Our Mission - We, as members of Our Lady of the Desert Church, through the guidance of our Blessed Mother Mary, are a community of believers in Jesus Christ, from whom we have the mission of making His Gospel alive in our parish and in the world. By living out His Gospel, we help to shape a society with greater respect for human life, economic and environmental justice, cultural diversity, and global solidarity, so that we will build a church where everyone feels welcome and through it will find happiness and salvation.

Nuestra Misión - Nosotros, como miembros de la Iglesia de Nuestra Señora del Desierto, con la dirección de Nuestra Madre María, somos una comunidad de creencia en Jesús Cristo, que tenemos la misión de hacer su evangelio vivo en nuestra parroquia y en el mundo. Viviendo su evangelio, ayudamos a formar una sociedad con mayor respecto a la vida humana, a la economía y justicia al ambiente, diversidad cultural, y la solidaridad global, de modo que construyamos una iglesia donde todos se sientan bienvenidos con felicidad y salvación.

Behold the Lamb of God Who Takes Away the Sins of the World! These powerful words of John the Baptist remind us of the paschal lamb whose blood was smeared on the door posts during the Passover to save the Jewish children from death (Exod. 12:22). They remind us of Jesus Christ whose blood was shed on the cross for our Passover from death to everlasting life.

But is this sacrifice of Jesus Christ for us something that happened only once, or is it something that keeps on happening? Our Church teaches that it keeps on happening. Christ in his sacrifice overcame death, and so his sacrifice transcends time and endures forever (CC 1084). That is great news for us. It means Christ is constantly interceding to the Father for us by offering his sacrifice for us (CCC 519). We call it Christ's "ever-present sacrifice."

We incorporate Christ's ever-present sacrifice in the sacrifice of the mass. We remember Christ's sacrifice. But we don't only remember it. In the spiritual realm it becomes present to us--we actually re-live it. That's why we call it the sacrifice of the Mass. And every time we re-live Jesus' sacrifice, it empowers us more and more to fight for our salvation (CCC 1364, 1364).

The mass is also our sacrifice because we unite our sacrifices of praise, sufferings, prayers, and good works, with Christ's sacrifice. And when we offer up our combined sacrifices to God they take on a new value—they become even more powerful (CCC 1368). They empower us and they transform us.

Then in the mass, after we offer up our sacrifices to God, we begin a special dialogue. We pray for a miracle. We say "Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world" three times. And we beg for Christ's mercy. We beg for Christ to hear us. Then something incredible happens. He answers our prayer for mercy.

When the priest holds up the Holy Eucharist, Christ comes to us in it. Christ has heard our prayer.

Christ says to us "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb."

Perhaps this is the quickest prayer ever answered. We pray for mercy, and Christ appears before us. But he comes to us broken. In the "fraction rite" the priest breaks the host. It represents Christ broken on the cross for us; the lamb slaughtered for our sins. And He is here in the Holy Eucharist as the Lamb of God sent to empower us with grace. For what? To become like him, servants of sacrifice for others in the Spirit of Jesus Christ.

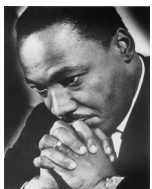
Este es el Cordero de Dios que quita el pecado del mundo! Estas poderosas palabras de Juan el Bautista nos recuerdan del cordero pascual, cuya sangre fue embarrada en los postes de las puertas durante la Pascua de los hebreos para salvar las vidas de los niños (Éxodo 12:22). Nos recuerdan a Jesucristo, cuya sangre fue derramada en la cruz por nuestra Pascua de la muerte a la vida eterna.

Pero, es este sacrificio de Jesucristo por nosotros algo que ocurrió sólo una vez, o es algo que sigue ocurriendo? La Iglesia nos enseña que sigue ocurriendo. Con su sacrificio, Cristo venció a la muerte, y por eso su sacrificio trasciende el tiempo y permanece para siempre (CC 1084). Eso es una gran noticia para nosotros. Significa que Cristo está constantemente intercediendo con el Padre por nosotros, al ofrecer su sacrificio por nosotros (CIC 519). Lo llamamos el sacrificio "siempre-presente" de Jesucristo.

Incorporamos el sacrificio "siempre-presente" de Jesucristo en el sacrificio de la misa. Recordamos el sacrificio de Cristo. Pero no sólo la recordamos. En la dimensión espiritual se nos hace presente – de veras lo revivimos. Por eso lo llamamos el sacrificio de la Misa. Y cada vez que revivimos el sacrificio de Jesucristo en la Misa, nos empodera cada vez más a luchar por nuestra salvación (CCC 1364, 1364).

La misa es nuestro sacrificio también porque unimos nuestros sacrificios de alabanzas, sufrimientos, oraciones y las buenas obras, con el sacrificio de Jesucristo. Y cuando le ofrecemos a Dios nuestros sacrificios combinados—se convierten en un sacrificio todavía mas poderoso (CCC 1368). Nos empoderan, y nos transforman.

Luego, después de ofrecerle a Dios nuestros sacrificios, empezamos un diálogo muy especial. Oramos por un milagro. Decimos "Cordero de Dios que quitas el pecados del mundo" tres veces. Y rogamos por su misericordia: "ten piedad de nosotros." Le rogamos que nos oiga. Entonces, algo increíble ocurre. Nos contesta la oración. Cuando el sacerdote levanta la Sagrada Eucaristía, Jesucristo se nos viene por ella. Cristo escucho nuestra oración. Cristo nos dice: "Este es el Cordero de Dios, que quita el pecado del mundo. Dichosos los invitados a la cena del Señor." Tal vez esta oración es la más rápida en contestarse. Oramos por misericordia, y Cristo se nos aparece. Pero Cristo se nos viene roto. En el rito de la "fracción " el sacerdote rompe la hostia. Representa a Jesucristo roto en la cruz por nosotros; el cordero sacrificado por nuestros pecados. Y Él está aquí en la Sagrada Eucaristía como el Cordero de Dios enviado para empoderarnos con la gracia. Para qué? Para convertirnos como él, en servidores de sacrificio por los demás--en el Espíritu de Jesucristo.

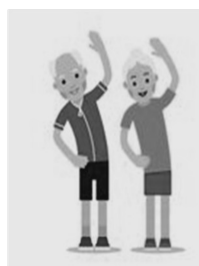

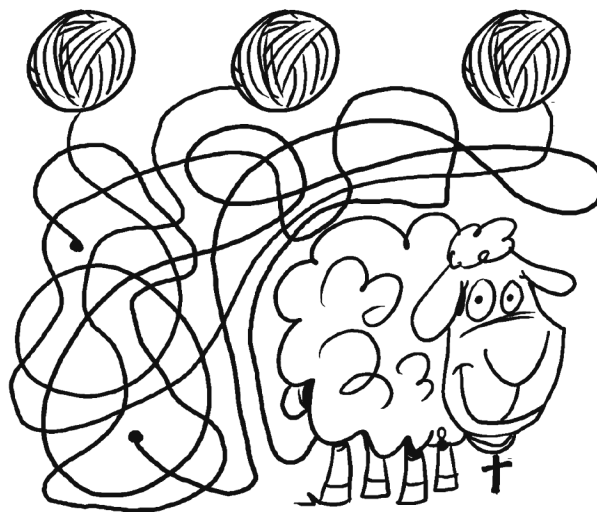
