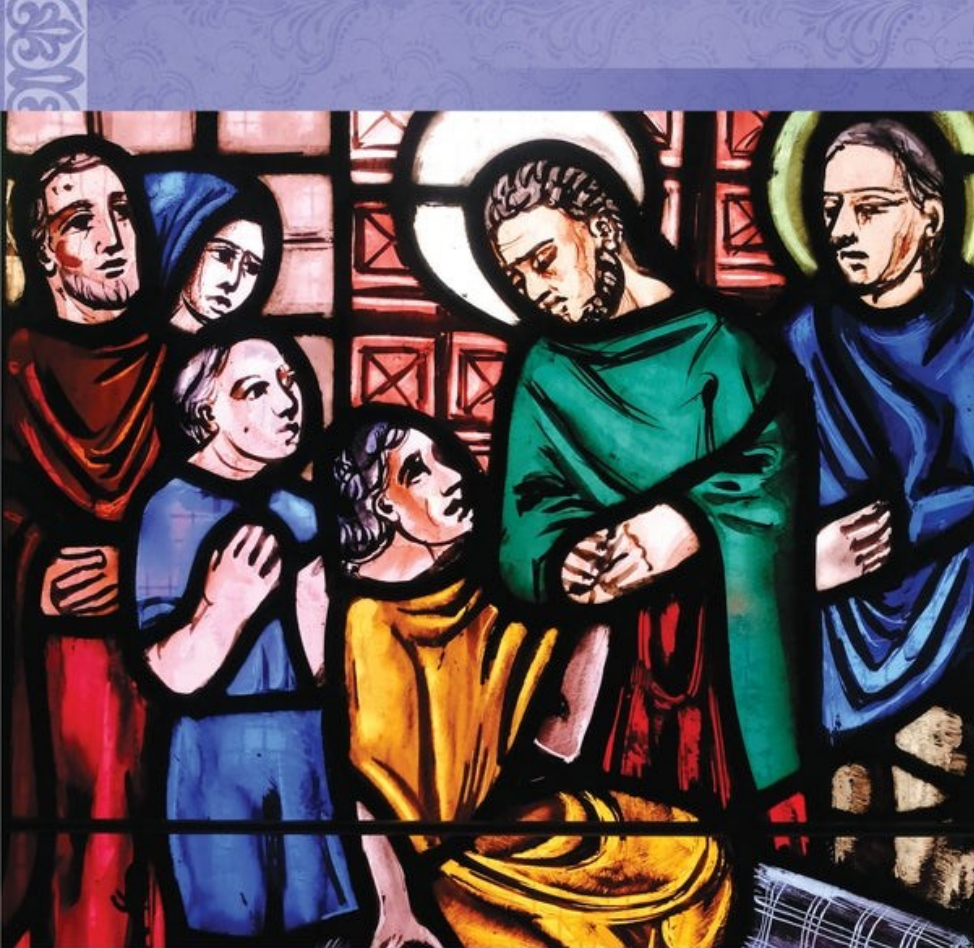

Our Mission - We, as members of Our Lady of the Desert Church, through the guidance of our Blessed Mother Mary, are a community of believers in Jesus Christ, from whom we have the mission of making His Gospel alive in our parish and in the world. By living out His Gospel, we help to shape a society with greater respect for human life, economic and environmental justice, cultural diversity, and global solidarity, so that we will build a church where everyone feels welcome and through it will find happiness and salvation.

Nuestra Misión - Nosotros, como miembros de la Iglesia de Nuestra Señora del Desierto, con la dirección de Nuestra Madre María, somos una comunidad de creencia en Jesús Cristo, que tenemos la misión de hacer su evangelio vivo en nuestra parroquia y en el mundo. Viviendo su evangelio, ayudamos a formar una sociedad con mayor respecto a la vida humana, a la economía y justicia al ambiente, diversidad cultural, y la solidaridad global, de modo que construyamos una iglesia donde todos se sientan bienvenidos con felicidad y salvación.

In the novitiate, I once walked into a McDonalds, and an elderly transient woman...introduced us to her friends, "These are Holy men of God." I smiled. Nobody ever said that about me. But now I realize...it's not about me. This is about you. Jesus is calling you to become a Holy man...a Holy woman...of God. Jesus is sending you into the world, with His power to take His place. But be not afraid. Jesus says "whoever receives you receives me." Jesus is so completely with you that when people welcome you they welcome Jesus.

Here is a piece of advice from Jesus: "If you love your mother, father, son or daughter more than me...guess what? you are not worthy of me." I'm not sure I like that. But what Jesus is really saying is that if you love Jesus more than anything else—even more than yourself...

Jesus will love your family through you. You will love your family with more love than you could ever give them—because it is the love that comes from God! Here is another piece of advice from Jesus: "Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." That is exactly what St. Paul is saying in the 2nd reading. In baptism you died to original sin with Christ, and you rose to a new life in Christ. It was a resurrection. But you have to keep resurrecting yourself. Keep dying to sin by going to confession. Keep rising to a new life by saying and doing what Jesus would do.

Bring healing and life into the world like Jesus did. We saw that in the 1st reading. A woman who was sterile welcomed the prophet Elisha, a Holy man of God, into her home. Because of that good deed, she was awarded with the gift of life when she conceives and bears a son. Bring healing and life into the world by proclaiming the Good News. What is the Good News? The Victory of Jesus Christ. It goes like this: In the beginning, Adam and Eve disobeyed God. We call that original sin. The consequence is death for everyone. The doors of heaven were slammed shut.

But God loves us too much for that. God came into the world as Jesus Christ and brought us the victory of the resurrection.

So we are no longer afraid of death...because death is only a passageway into everlasting life. At the end of time our soul will be reunited with our body. And the doors of heaven will swing wide open for us.

What about suffering? The other day I went to visit a parishioner who is dying and suffering horribly. And he wonders, why can't Jesus just take me now? What could I tell him? What is the Good News in suffering?

The Good News is that when you suffer, you have a special calling--to unite your suffering with the suffering of Jesus on that cross. If you can do that... you will work together with Jesus on that cross for the victory against evil and for the salvation of the world!

And the Good News is this: we don't have to do it alone. Jesus Christ will always be with us: And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age (Mt 28:20).

En el novicio, entré una vez en un McDonalds, y una anciana sin hogar ... nos presentó a sus amigos, "Estos son hombres santos de Dios." Sonreí. Nadie había dicho eso de mí. Pero ahora me doy cuenta ... no se trata de mí. Sino de ti. Jesús te llama a convertirte en un hombre santo ... una mujer santa ... de Dios. Jesús te está mandando al mundo, con Su poder para tomar Su lugar. Pero no tengas miedo. Jesús dice que "el que te recibe a ti, me recibe a mí". Jesús está tan completamente contigo que cuando la gente te da la bienvenida, dan la bienvenida a Jesús.

Aquí está un consejo de Jesús: "Si amas a tu madre, padre, hijo o hija más que a mí ... ¿sabes qué? No eres digno de mí." No estoy seguro si me gusta eso. Pero lo que Jesús de veras está diciendo es que si amas a Jesús más que a cualquier otra cosa-hasta más que a ti mismo ... Jesús amará a tu familia a través de ti. Amarás a tu familia con más amor de lo que jamás podrías darles,-- ¡porque es el amor que viene de Dios!

Aquí hay otro consejo de Jesús: "El que salve su vida la perderá, y el que pierda por mí, la salvará". Eso es exactamente lo que dice San Pablo en la segunda lectura. En el bautismo te moriste al pecado original con Cristo, y te resucitaste a una nueva vida en Cristo. Fue una resurrección. Pero tienes que seguir resucitando a ti mismo. Sigue muriendo al pecado yendo a la confesión. Sigue resucitando a una nueva vida diciendo y haciendo lo que haría Jesús.

Trae la sanación y la vida al mundo como lo hizo Jesús. Lo vimos en la primera lectura. Una mujer estéril dio la bienvenida al profeta Eliseo, un hombre santo de Dios, invitándolo a su casa. Debido a esa buena acción, se le concedió el regalo de la vida cuando concibe y tiene un hijo. Trae la sanación y la vida al mundo proclamando la Buena Nueva. ¿Qué es la Buena Nueva? La victoria de Jesucristo. Va como esto: En el principio, Adán y Eva desobedecieron a Dios. Llamamos a eso, el pecado original. La consecuencia es la muerte para todos. Las puertas del cielo se cerraron de golpe.

Pero Dios nos ama demasiado para eso. Dios vino al mundo como Jesucristo y nos trajo la victoria de la resurrección.

Así que ya no tenemos miedo de la muerte ... porque la muerte es sólo un pasaje a la vida eterna. Al final de los tiempos nuestra alma se juntará con nuestro cuerpo. Y las puertas del cielo se abrirán completamente para nosotros.

¿Qué de, el sufrimiento? El otro día fui a visitar a un parroquiano que está muriendo y sufriendo terriblemente. Y se pregunta, ¿por qué Jesús no puede tomarme ahora mismo? ¿Qué podía decirle? ¿Qué es la Buena Nueva en el sufrimiento? La Buena Nueva es que cuando sufres, tienes un llamado especial—de unir tu sufrimiento con el sufrimiento de Jesús en esa cruz. Si puedes hacer eso ... tu vas a trabajar junto con Jesús en esa cruz para la victoria contra el mal y para la salvación del mundo!

Y la Buena Nueva es esta: no tenemos que hacerlo solos. Jesucristo estará siempre con nosotros: Y sepan que yo estoy con ustedes todos los días hasta el final de los tiempos (Mt 28:20).
