

Today Jesus Christ is calling you to join him on the mountain top. It is the mountain top of another world where time no longer exists...where matter is transfigured...where Jesus Christ becomes dazzling white brighter than the sun...where the invisible and the unbelievable are the truth...where you will encounter Jesus Christ who you are going to become when you follow Him through death into resurrection.

There--on the mountain top of that altar—you are not just going to sit back and contemplate. You are going to encounter and participate in His death and resurrection. Because you are going to accomplish His death and resurrection in your life. This is all about your exodus from death into life.

Join Him on that mountain top of hope—the Holy Altar...His Holy Altar. On that mountain top, all of a sudden—you will share with Jesus Christ in His last supper. Jesus will break the bread and give it to you saying “Take this and eat of it, for this is my body which will be given up for you.” Jesus will pick up the chalice and give it to you saying “Take this and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in memory of me.”

Then Jesus is going to come down those steps from the mountain top of that altar into the midst of human life and come inside of you to live inside of you and to give you all the power you need for obedience and for love...to obey His will, to follow His way, to carry your cross, and to carry the cross for others.

But just like Peter, you are not going to want to leave. You will say, “Lord, it is good for us to be here.” Can you blame him? Who wants to come down from that mountain? But you have to pass through the cross to get to the resurrection. Jesus had to face his cross. Peter, James and John also had to face their cross. And you disciple of Jesus Christ—no disciple while you are in this world—can remain on that mountain top. You have to descend.

You have a job to do. But how? Like St. Paul said, Bear your hardship...for the gospel...with the strength that comes from God. What strength? Last Sunday you heard about Jesus’ victory when he overcame Satan’s temptation in the desert. How did He overcome it? By his total love and trust for God. Use that. That is your weapon this lent. Fast—pray—give alms by doing good things for others, especially the poor. Repent of your sins and go to confession. Turn that love that Jesus has for God—that now is inside of you—into your love for God. So Jesus says “Go”--“go down from the mountain with me and together let’s go out through those doors and into a broken world to share your encounter and your glimpse of my glory—and your transfiguration into me-- with all our brothers and sisters who are so much in need.

“Let’s carry the cross together by facing our suffering and offering it up together for the forgiveness of sins and the salvation of the world. Let’s carry the cross for others by reaching out to love and care for the poor, the hungry, the sick, the homeless, the alcoholics, the drug addicts, the mentally ill, the suicidal, those in prison, those who are slaves to sin, and anyone else who needs us.”

Hoy Jesucristo te llama a unirte a él en la cima del monte. Es la cima del monte de otro mundo donde el tiempo ya no existe... donde la materia se transfigura ... donde Jesucristo se vuelve resplandeciente en blanco y más brillante que el sol ... donde lo invisible y lo increíble son la verdad ... donde vas a tener un encuentro con Jesucristo, y en el te vas a convertir cuando lo sigues a través de la muerte a la resurrección. Allí - en la cima del monte de ese altar - no sólo vas a sentarte y contemplar. Vas a tener un encuentro y vas a participar en Su muerte y resurrección. Porque tu vas a lograr Su muerte y resurrección en tu vida. Esto se trata de tu éxodo de la muerte a la vida. Júntate a El en esa cima del monte de la esperanza-el Santo Altar ... Su Santo Altar. De repente, en esa cima del monte—vas a compartir con Jesucristo en Su última cena. Jesús va a romper el pan y compartirlo contigo diciendo: “Tomen y coman todos de él, porque esto es mi cuerpo que será entregado por ustedes.” Jesús va a levantar el cáliz y compartirlo contigo diciendo: “Tomen y beban todos de él, porque este es el cáliz de mi sangre, sangre de la alianza nueva y eterna que será derramada por ustedes y por todo los hombres para el perdón de los pecados. Hagan esto en memoria de mí.”

Entonces Jesús va bajar del cima del monte de ese altar por ese escalón para entrar en la vida humana, y va entrar dentro de ti para vivir dentro de ti y darte todo el poder que necesitas para obedecer y para amar...para obedecer a Su voluntad, para seguir a Su camino, para cargar tu cruz, y para cargar la cruz por los demás. Pero al igual que Pedro, no vas a querer bajar. Dirás: “Señor, que bueno sería quedarnos aquí!” ¿Puedes culparlo? ¿Quién quiere bajar de esa montaña? Pero tienes que pasar por la cruz para llegar a la resurrección. Jesús tuvo que enfrentar su cruz. Pedro, Santiago y Juan también tuvieron que enfrentar su cruz. Y tú, discípulo de Jesucristo—ningún discípulo mientras estás en este mundo—puedes permanecer en esa cima de la montaña. Tienes que descender. Tienes una obra que hacer. ¿Pero cómo? Como San Pablo dijo: “Comparte...los sufrimientos por la predicación del Evangelio, sostenido por la fuerza de Dios.” ¿Qué fuerza? El domingo pasado te enteraste de la victoria de Jesús cuando venció en el desierto las tentaciones de Satanás. ¿Cómo lo superó? Por su amor y confianza total para Dios. Usa eso. Esa es tu arma de la cuaresma. Ayunar—rezar—dar limosna, haciendo cosas buenas para los demás, especialmente para los pobres. Arrepiéntete de tus pecados y vete a la confesión. Convierte ese amor que Jesús tiene por Dios--que ahora está dentro de ti--en tu amor por Dios. Así que Jesús dice “Váyase” - “Baja de la montaña conmigo y juntos salgamos por esas puertas para entrar en un mundo quebrado para compartir de tu encuentro y tu vislumbre de mi gloria - y tu transfiguración en mí - con todos nuestros Hermanos y hermanas que están tan necesitados. “Vamos a cargar la cruz juntos y enfrentar nuestros sufrimientos, ofreciéndolos juntos para el perdón de los pecados y la salvación del mundo. Vamos a cargar la cruz por los demás a través de amar y cuidar a los pobres, los hambrientos, los enfermos, los sin casa, los alcohólicos, los drogadictos, los enfermos de la mente, los que quieren suicidarse, los encarcelados, los que son esclavos del pecado, y cualquier otra persona que nos necesite.”






LIFETEEN SHOE DRIVE
