When Jesus finally does arrive, Martha and Mary say: "Lord, [where were you]? If you had been here, [our] brother would not have died." What does Jesus do? Jesus wept. He felt their pain and sadness. And it moved him.

But Jesus' love for Lazarus and for us, goes way beyond weeping. A love like that cannot be contained. It explodes. It comes bursting out. It is so powerful that it raises Lazarus from the dead. Jesus says, "take away the stone," "untie him and let him go." The bonds of death are broken. And that becomes a preview of what Jesus has in store for you and I.

Can you feel how much Jesus' loves you? You should. Why? Because Lazarus is you. This is your story. It is a love story between God, Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit and you—and the climax is about to take place on that cross. That is how much Jesus Christ loves you—with his arms wide open.

Like Lazarus you were once dead in your sin. But God changed all that. God came into the world and gave you the gift of life. It went something like this: "Abba, Father, all things are possible to you; remove this chalice from me; yet, not what I will, but what you will" (Mk. 14:36). "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do" (Lk. 23:34). "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" (Mt. 27:46; Mk. 15:34). "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit" (Lk. 23:46). "It is finished" Then he bowed his head and gave up his spirit (Jn. 19:30). [+]

For the sake of His sorrowful passion, have mercy on us and on all the world.

That gift was the gift of life. It brought us victory over death. We are no longer afraid of death. Now death is merely a passage to the resurrection and a new life in Jesus Christ. And beginning in this life—right now—we are being resurrected to a new life in Jesus Christ.

The question is this: What will be your gift to Jesus Christ this Easter? Jesus is calling you to come out of the tomb of sin and death and to rise up to a new life in Him. "Take away the stone." "Lazarus, come out!" And Jesus is telling you to "untie him and let him go free." That means Jesus is calling you to bring his life-giving love--that brings freedom--to anyone who is suffering, in need or in bondage to sin. How are you going to do that? By sharing the life-giving love Jesus gave you with everyone. By obeying and cooperating with God to work miracles through you. By weeping and healing anyone who is suffering. By giving to anyone in need. Now you can roll away the stone that stands between sinners and the mercy of Jesus Christ. Now you can unbind anyone who has offended you by forgiving them and letting them go free. That is how you will resurrect others into a new life in Jesus Christ.

Cuando Jesús por fin llega, Marta y María dicen: "Señor, [¿dónde estabas]? Si hubieras estado aquí, no habría muerto [nuestro] hermano." ¿Qué hace Jesús? Jesús se puso a llorar. Sintió su dolor y tristeza. Y lo conmovió.

Pero el amor de Jesús por Lázaro y para nosotros, es mucho más que llorar. Un amor como ese no se puede contener. Explota. Brota por fuera. Es tan poderoso que resucita a Lázaro de entre los muertos. Jesús dice: "Quiten la piedra", "desátenlo, para que pueda andar." Los lazos de la muerte están rotos. Y eso es un avance de lo que Jesús tiene planeado para ti y para mí.

Puedes sentir lo mucho que te ama Jesús? Debieras. ¿Por qué? Porque tú eres Lázaro. Esta es tu historia. Es una historia de amor entre Dios, Jesucristo, el Espíritu Santo y tu--y el clímax está a punto de ocurrir en esa cruz. Eso es lo mucho que Jesucristo te ama--con los brazos bien abiertos.

Así como Lázaro, una vez fuiste muerto en tu pecado. Pero Dios cambió todo eso. Dios vino al mundo y te dio el don de la vida. Fue algo como esto: "Abba, Padre, para ti todo es posible, aparta de mí esta copa. Pero no se haga lo que yo quiero, sino lo que quieres tu" (Mc. 14:36). "Padre, perdónalos, porque no saben lo que hacen" (Lc 23:34). "Dios mío, Dios mío, ¿por qué me has abandonado?" (Mt. 27:46; Mc 15:34).

"Padre, en tus manos encomiendo mi espíritu" (Lc. 23:46). "Todo está cumplido" Después inclino la cabeza y entrego el espíritu (Jn 19:30). [+]

Por el bien de su dolorosa pasión, ten misericordia de nosotros y del todo el mundo.

Ese regalo fue el don de la vida. Nos trajo la victoria sobre la muerte. Ya no tenemos miedo de la muerte. Ahora la muerte es solo un pasaje a la resurrección y una nueva vida en Jesucristo. Y empezando en esta vida—ahorita mismo—andamos resucitando a una nueva vida en Jesucristo. La pregunta es esta: ¿Que va ser tu regalo para Jesucristo esta Pascua? Jesús te está llamando a salir de la tumba del pecado y la muerte—y que resucites a una nueva vida en Él.

"Quiten la piedra." "¡Lázaro, sal de ahí!" Y Jesús te está diciendo: "Desátenlo, para que pueda andar." Eso significa que Jesús te está llamando para llevar su amor que da vida—que trae libertad--a cualquier persona que está sufriendo, que se encuentra en necesidad, o que es un esclavo del pecado.

¿Cómo vas a hacer eso? Al compartir el amor que da vida--que Jesús te dio--con todo el mundo. Al obedecer y cooperar con Dios para hacer milagros a través de ti. Al llorar y sanar a cualquier persona que está sufriendo. Al ayudar a cualquier persona en necesidad. Ahora tu puedes quitar la piedra que se interpone entre los pecadores y la misericordia de Jesucristo. Ahora tu puedes desvincular cualquier persona que te ha ofendido perdonándoles y dejándolos con libertad. De esa manera vas a resucitar a los demás a una nueva vida en Jesucristo.



LIFETEEN SHOE DRIVE
