Our Mission - We, as members of Our Lady of the Desert Church, through the guidance of our Blessed Mother Mary, are a community of believers in Jesus Christ, from whom we have the mission of making His Gospel alive in our parish and in the world. By living out His Gospel, we help to shape a society with greater respect for human life, economic and environmental justice, cultural diversity, and global solidarity, so that we will build a church where everyone feels welcome and through it will find happiness and salvation.

Nuestra Misión - Nosotros, como miembros de la Iglesia de Nuestra Señora del Desierto, con la dirección de Nuestra Madre María, somos una comunidad de creencia en Jesús Cristo, que tenemos la misión de hacer su evangelio vivo en nuestra parroquia y en el mundo. Viviendo su evangelio, ayudamos a formar una sociedad con mayor respecto a la vida humana, a la economía y justicia al ambiente, diversidad cultural, y la solidaridad global, de modo que construyamos una iglesia donde todos se sientan bienvenidos con felicidad y salvación.

The Holy Trinity is God in three persons. In a word, God is love. That makes perfect sense because in order for love to exist you need three things: the lover, who is God, the beloved, who is Jesus, and the love between them, which is the Holy Spirit. It is like when a man and a woman love each other so much, that their love comes pouring out of them. Their love creates a child as way of sharing their love with the world. That is why God created us. God wants to share his love with us. In fact God loves us so much God acted first. Before we believed in God, and while we were still sinners, God loved us.

Have you noticed that you always see John 3:16 on banners at sporting events: God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. The amazing thing is God loves us that much—with all his heart—as if we are the only person that ever mattered.

Why is that so important? It is important because now God is asking us “Do you love me?” Why is God asking us that? Because God decided long ago—before he created the world and before he created us—that he was going to call us to return to Him by faith and love.

God intentionally created a world in which we are to believe in Him and love Him. And we can transform that world into the Kingdom of God only if we exist as someone who returns to Him by believing in Him and by loving Him. So our response to God has to be: “Yes I love you.” But we can’t just say it. We have to show it in everything we say, everything we do, and in who we are. How can we do that? By living in the communion of the Holy Trinity with each other. How can we do that? Like St. Paul tells us, we have to imitate the Holy Trinity.

1. We need to make a sacrifice of our lives to each other. God loves us so much that He died so we might live forever. That is why the greatest symbol of love is not the Cupid with his arrow but Jesus on the crucifix. “No one has greater love than this, to lay down one’s life for one’s friends” (Jn. 15:13). How are we supposed to make that sacrifice? We have to carry our cross and follow Jesus by loving each other and serving each other. (Mk. 9:35; Mt. 10:29; 16:25; Lk. 9:24; 17:23; Jn. 12:24-26).

2. We need to be merciful to each other. Like Jesus said “Be merciful, as your heavenly father is merciful” (Lk. 6:36). That means we have to forgive anyone who offends us, even if they don’t apologize, and even if they are our enemies. We saw that in the first words of Jesus from the Cross: “Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing” (Lk. 23:32).

3. We need to pass God’s love on to each other. We have to participate in the priesthood of Christ by receiving the love from God and then passing it on to everyone around us. Let’s pass God’s love on to each other by living for each other, by being humble, by respecting each other as equals, by consoling each other, by defending the weak, by forgiving, by bringing peace, by helping each other to avoid sin, and by standing up for Jesus in even when it isn’t popular (Mt. 5:1-12).

La Santísima Trinidad es Dios en tres personas. En solo una palabra, Dios es amor. Eso tiene mucho sentido porque para que exista el amor se necesitan tres cosas: el amante, que es Dios, el amado, que es Jesús, y el amor entre ellos, que es el Espíritu Santo. Es como cuando un hombre y una mujer se aman tanto, que su amor viene fluyendo fuera de ellos. Su amor crea a un niño como manera de compartir su amor con el mundo. Por eso Dios nos creó. Dios quiere compartir su amor con nosotros. De hecho, Dios nos ama tanto Dios actuó primero. Antes de creer en Dios, y cuando todavía éramos pecadores, Dios nos amó.

¿Has notado que siempre se ve Juan 3:16 en pancartas en los eventos deportivos: Tanto amó Dios al mundo que le entregó a su Hijo único, para que todo el que crea en él no perezca, sino que tenga la vida eterna. Lo asombroso es que Dios nos ama de esa manera - con todo su corazón -- como si fuéramos la única persona que importaba.

¿Por qué es tan importante? Es importante porque ahora Dios nos pregunta: “¿Tu me amas?” ¿Por qué Dios nos pregunta eso? Porque Dios decidió hace mucho tiempo—antes de crear el mundo y antes de crearnos a nosotros—que él nos iba a llamar para volver a Él por la fe y el amor. De propósito, Dios creó un mundo en el que hemos de creer en Él y amarlo. Y podemos transformar ese mundo en el Reino de Dios sólo si existimos como alguien que vuelve a Él, creyendo en Él y amándolo. Así que nuestra respuesta a Dios tiene que ser: “Sí Te amo.” Pero no podemos solo decirlo. Tenemos que mostrarlo en todo lo que decimos, todo lo que hacemos y en quien somos.

¿Cómo podemos hacer eso? Al vivir en la comunión de la Santísima Trinidad con los demás. ¿Cómo podemos hacer eso? Como dijo San Pablo, tenemos que imitar a la Santísima Trinidad.

1. Tenemos que hacer un sacrificio de nuestra vida por los demás. Dios nos ama tanto que Él murió para que pudiéramos vivir para siempre. Por eso, el mayor símbolo del amor no es el Cupido con su flecha sino Jesús en el crucifijo. “No hay amor más grande que dar la vida por sus amigos” (Jn 15:13). ¿Cómo se supone que vamos a hacer ese sacrificio? Tenemos que cargar nuestra cruz y seguir a Jesús en amar a los demás y servir a los demás (Mk. 9:35; Mt. 10:29; 16:25; Lk. 9:24; 17:23; Jn. 12:24-26).

2. Tenemos que ser misericordiosos con los demás. Como dijo Jesús: “Sean compasivos como es compasivo el Padre de ustedes” (Lc 6:36). Eso significa que tenemos que perdonar a todos los que nos ofenden, hasta cuando no se disculpan, y hasta si son nuestros enemigos. Lo vimos en las primeras palabras de Jesús desde la cruz: “Padre, perdónalos, porque no saben lo que hacen”(Lc 23:32).

3. Tenemos que pasar el amor de Dios a los demás. Tenemos que participar en el sacerdocio de Cristo al recibir el amor de Dios y luego pasándolo a los que nos rodean. Vamos a pasar el amor de Dios a los demás—viviendo por los demás, siendo humildes, respetándonos como iguales, consolándonos, defendiendo los débiles, al perdonar, al traer la paz, al ayudarnos entre sí para evitar el pecado, y al defender a Jesús aunque no sea popular (Mt. 5:1-12).

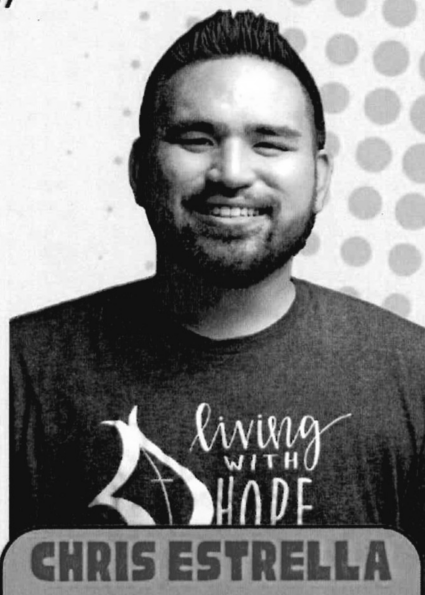

The Most Holy Trinity • John 3:16-18
