Today we pray for all the souls in purgatory being purified and growing in love for God, in preparation for when they will see God face to face in heaven. Our doctrine of Purgatory was formulated at the councils of Florence and Trent where the Church said: "As for certain lesser faults, we must believe that, before the Final Judgment, there is a purifying fire. Why and what are they being purified from? We believe that every sin has a double consequence.

(1) The first consequence of Mortal sin is what we call the "eternal punishment" of sin. It is an eternal punishment because we are separated from God for eternity. But Jesus' death and resurrection forgive us of our sins and restores our communion with God (provided we repent and confess our sins). So the "eternal punishment" of sin is taken away. That means if we repent and confess our sins we will be saved. That is not the only consequence because when we sin we not only turn away from God, but we also turn toward something other than God. That turning toward something else causes the second consequence.

(2) The second consequence is that all sins (Mortal and Venial) cause an unhealthy attachment to things that aren't God. That unhealthy attachment is what we call the "temporal punishment" of sin. Even if our sins are forgiven, we need to be purified from this "temporal punishment" of sin, either during our lifetime or after our lifetime in Purgatory. (CCC 1472). But we should not view this purification in purgatory as punishment from God for our sins. It is not a torture chamber. There is pain. But it is the kind of pain we will experience when we realize we failed at love. In a sense it is really a gift. In purgatory we are already in the loving arms of our merciful father and we are guaranteed a place in heaven. And so today we celebrate mass for the souls in purgatory. They need our help in their purification. And we can help them with our prayers. Let's help the souls in purgatory by praying for them. Let's help them by offering our fasting, almsgiving, and pilgrimages in atonement for their sins. Let's gain indulgences for them this week. Today on All Souls Day, we can gain a plenary indulgence, which removes all the temporal punishment of a sin, for either ourselves or for the souls in purgatory if we do 5 things (Canon 994):

1. Come to Church and pray the Creed and one Our Father.
2. Pray for the Pope's intentions. (It is OK to recite on Our Father and Hail Mary for his intentions. Canon 993)
3. Receive Holy Communion within a week before or afterwards.
4. Go to confession within a week before or afterwards. (Venial sins are forgiven in mass)
5. Be in a state of grace (without sin).

Hoy rezamos por todas las almas del purgatorio siendo purificadas y creciendo en el amor a Dios, en preparación para cuando ellos verán a Dios cara a cara en el cielo. Nuestra doctrina del purgatorio fue formulada en los concilios de Florencia y de Trento, donde la Iglesia, dijo: "En cuanto hay ciertas faltas ligeras, tenemos que creer, que antes del juicio final, existe un fuego purificador. ¿Por qué, y de qué se están purificando?

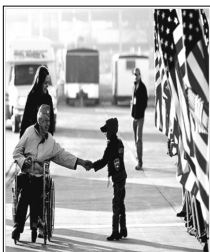
Creemos que cada pecado tiene una doble consecuencia. (1) La primera consecuencia del pecado mortal es lo que llamamos la "castigo eterno" del pecado. Es un castigo eterno porque estamos separados de Dios por toda la eternidad. Pero la muerte y resurrección de Jesús nos perdona los pecados y restablece nuestra comunión con Dios (mientras nos arrepentimos y confesamos nuestros pecados). Así que el "castigo eterno" del pecado se quita. Esto significa que si nos arrepentimos y confesamos nuestros pecados seremos salvados.

Esa no es la única consecuencia porque que cuando pecamos, no sólo le damos la espalda a Dios, sino que también nos volteamos y nos dirigimos hacia algo que no es Dios. Ese volteo hacia algo que no es Dios causa la segunda consecuencia. (2) La segunda consecuencia es que todos los pecados (mortales y veniales) causan un apego desordenado a las cosas que no son Dios. Ese apego desordenado es lo que llamamos el "castigo temporal" del pecado. Hasta cuando nuestros pecados son perdonados, necesitamos ser purificados de este "castigo temporal" del pecado, sea durante nuestra vida o después de nuestra vida en el purgatorio. (CCC 1472).

Pero no debemos ver esta purificación en el purgatorio como si fuera castigo de Dios por nuestros pecados. No es una cámara de tortura. Hay un dolor. Pero es el tipo de dolor que vamos a experimentar cuando nos damos cuenta de que fallamos en el amor. En cierto modo, es realmente un regalo. En el purgatorio ya estamos en los brazos amorosos de nuestro Padre misericordioso y nos garantiza un lugar en el cielo.

Y por eso hoy se celebra esta misa por las almas en el purgatorio. Ellos necesitan nuestra ayuda en su purificación. Y nosotros les podemos ayudar con nuestras oraciones. Vamos a ayudar a las almas en el purgatorio, orando por ellos. Vamos a ayudarlos ofreciendo nuestro ayuno, las limosnas y la peregrinación, en expiación por sus pecados. Vamos a ganar indulgencias para ellos esta semana. Hoy, en el Día de los Difuntos, podemos ganar la indulgencia plenaria, que elimina el "castigo temporal" del pecado, por nosotros o por las almas del purgatorio, si hacemos 5 cosas (Canon 994):

1. Ven a la iglesia y reza el Credo y el Padre Nuestro.
2. Oremos por las intenciones del Papa. (Está bien rezar el Padre Nuestro y el Ave María por sus intenciones. Canon 993)
3. Recibe la Sagrada Comunión dentro de una semana antes o después.
4. Ve a confesión dentro de una semana antes o después. (Los pecados veniales son perdonados al tomar la comunión).
5. Debemos estar en un estado de gracia (sin pecado).

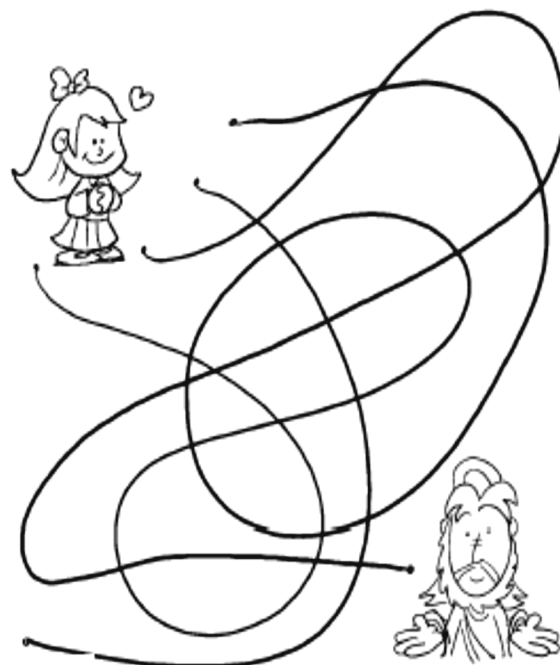
