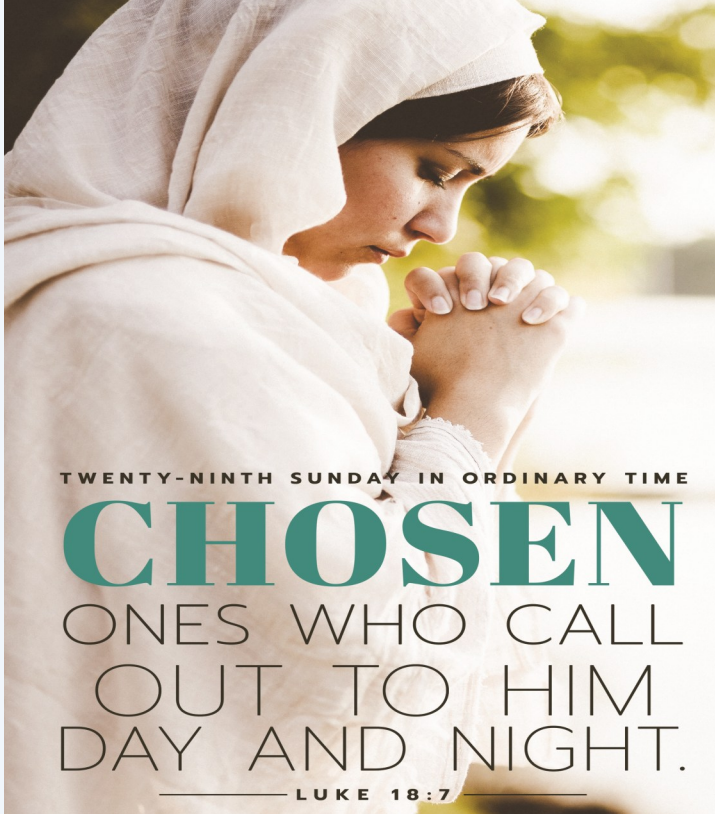

Our Mission - We, as members of Our Lady of the Desert Church, through the guidance of our Blessed Mother Mary, are a community of believers in Jesus Christ, from whom we have the mission of making His Gospel alive in our parish and in the world. By living out His Gospel, we help to shape a society with greater respect for human life, economic and environmental justice, cultural diversity, and global solidarity, so that we will build a church where everyone feels welcome and through it will find happiness and salvation.

Nuestra Misión - Nosotros, como miembros de la Iglesia de Nuestra Señora del Desierto, con la dirección de Nuestra Madre María, somos una comunidad de creencia en Jesús Cristo, que tenemos la misión de hacer su evangelio vivo en nuestra parroquia y en el mundo. Viviendo su evangelio, ayudamos a formar una sociedad con mayor respecto a la vida humana, a la economía y justicia al ambiente, diversidad cultural, y la solidaridad global, de modo que construyamos una iglesia donde todos se sientan bienvenidos con felicidad y salvación.

Our message for today is to pray constantly. Even if our prayers aren't answered. How long should we keep praying? As long as it takes. We should storm the heavens with our prayers. Just like in the parable. The poor widow had no money to bribe the corrupt judge. But she was persistent. And, the judge was embarrassed. So, he gave her whatever she wanted.

One way to pray is to have a personal conversation with God. One of the greatest gifts my mother gave me when I was a boy, is she would tell me to go to my room and talk to Jesus. It means talking to Jesus or God, (by thinking it or saying it) all day long. But we also have to listen to what God and Jesus are saying to us in our heart. Like the boy-prophet Samuel said: *Speak Lord, for your servant is listening* (1 Sam 3:9).

A second way to pray is called *lectio divina*. You read a text from Sacred Scripture. You find a word that moves you. You meditate on it. And, ask God what it means for your life. Do you know why that is important? Because like St. Paul said in the second reading: the scriptures will equip us to teach, correct, lead others to righteousness, and to do every good work (2 Tm 3:16-17). In other words, God gave us the sacred scriptures so that we can become more like God.

A third way to pray is the Rosary. This was given to us by the Blessed Virgin Mary so that we can grow in holiness because we actually enter into the lives of Jesus Christ and the Virgin Mary.

A fourth way to pray is the Holy Mass. Here in this mass, we will experience on that altar, Jesus at the Last Supper and Jesus' sacrifice of redemption on that cross. He will call down the Holy Spirit to transform the bread and wine into His body and blood. In the Holy Eucharist, Jesus will come to live inside of us. He will be our strength. And, when we pray together, we will be each other's strength. We will help one another to persevere in faith. We saw that in the first reading. As long as Moses kept his hands raised up in prayer, Israel would be winning. But when he lowered his hands, the enemy would be winning. So, his friends, Aaron and Hur, helped him hold his hands up and Israel won the battle. In the same way, in this mass, we will hold each other up by praying together and praying for each other.

And, a fifth way to pray is to become the prayer. That means we should offer everything we do—our very lives—up to God. A good way to do that might be to kneel down as soon as you wake up. Offer up to God everything you will do during the day. Maybe keep a prayer list and offer—everything you will do—for them. Ask God to use you to bring life and light to others. Ask God to make you a channel of Jesus' love and mercy. And ask Jesus to touch the lives of others through you. Then, at the end of the day, kneel down (if you can't, just bow your head) and thank God for giving you the opportunity to serve Him.

Nuestro mensaje para hoy es orar constantemente. Hasta si nuestras oraciones no son correspondidas. ¿Cuánto tiempo debemos seguir orando? Lo que sea necesario. Debemos atormentar a los cielos con nuestras oraciones. Como en la parábola. La viuda pobre no tenía dinero para darle mordida al juez corrupto. Pero ella fue muy persistente. Y al juez le dio vergüenza. Así que le dio todo lo que ella quería.

Una manera de orar es tener una conversación personal con Dios. Uno de los regalos más grandes que me dio mi madre cuando era niño, es que me decía que fuera a mi cuarto para hablar con Jesús. Significa hablar con Jesús o Dios, (pensándolo o diciéndolo) todo el día. Pero también tenemos que escuchar lo que Dios y Jesús nos dicen en nuestro corazón. Como dijo el niño profeta Samuel: *Habla Señor, que tu siervo escucha* (1 Sam 3:9).

Una segunda manera de orar se llama *lectio divina*. Lees un texto de la Sagrada Escritura. Encuentras una palabra que te conmueve. Lo meditas. Y pregúntale a Dios qué significa eso para tu vida. ¿Sabes por qué eso es importante? Porque como dijo San Pablo en la segunda lectura: las Escrituras nos preparan para enseñar, corregir, guiar en la virtud y para hacer toda obra buena (2 Tm 3, 16-17). Es decir, Dios nos dio las Sagradas Escrituras para que podamos llegar a ser más como Dios.

Una tercera manera de rezar es el Rosario. Esto nos lo dio la Santísima Virgen María para que podamos crecer en santidad porque de veras entramos en la vida de Jesucristo y la Virgen María.

Una cuarta manera de orar es la Santa Misa. Aquí, en esta misa, vamos a experimentar en ese altar a Jesús en la Última Cena y el sacrificio redentor de Jesús en esa cruz. Invocará al Espíritu Santo para que transforme el pan y el vino en Su cuerpo y sangre. Entonces, en la Sagrada Eucaristía, Jesús vendrá a vivir dentro de nosotros. Él será nuestra fortaleza. Y, cuando oramos juntos, nosotros seremos la fuerza los unos para los otros. Nos ayudaremos a perseverar en la fe. Lo vimos en la primera lectura. Cuando Moisés tenía las manos en alto, dominaba Israel. Pero cuando las bajaba, dominaba el enemigo. Así que, sus amigos, Aarón y Hur, lo ayudaron a levantar las manos e Israel ganó la batalla. De la misma manera, en esta misa, nos apoyaremos unos a otros orando juntos y orando unos por otros.

Y, una quinta manera de orar es convertirnos en la oración. Eso quiere decir que debemos ofrecer todo lo que hacemos--nuestras propias vidas--a Dios. Una buena manera de hacerlo es: ponte de rodillas cuando te despiertas. Ofrécele a Dios todo lo que harás durante el día. Tal vez mantiene una lista de oración y ofrece—lo que vas a hacer--por ellos. Pídele a Dios que te use para traer vida y luz a los demás. Pídele a Dios que te haga un canal del amor y la misericordia de Jesús. Y pídele a Jesús que toque la vida de los demás a través de ti. Luego, al final del día, ponte de rodillas, (si no puedes, entonces inclina la cabeza) y dale gracias a Dios por darte la oportunidad de servirle.

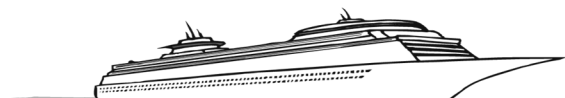

**Children and Adults are encouraged to
dress as saints. Look them up and learn:**

1) ST. MARIA GORETTI (1890-1902)
Known as the patroness of rape victims, Maria Goretti was martyred at age 11. She preferred to die rather than lose her purity. She forgave her attacker before passing away.

2) ST. DOMINIC SAVIO (1842-1857)
A student of St. John Bosco, Dominic Savio stood out for his piety and love of God from an early age. He died at the age of 14 and is known for his quote: "I'd rather die than sin".

3) ST. THERESE OF LISIEUX (1873-1897)
Known as "The Little Flower," Saint Therese of the Child Jesus entered Carmel at age 15 and lived there until her early death at age 24. She is famous for her "Little Way" of love and simplicity.

4) BL. PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI (1901-1925)
Nicknamed "the man of the eight beatitudes," Pier Giorgio was a young Italian passionate about mountaineering, the Eucharist, and charity for the poor. He died at age 24.

5) ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI (1181-1226)
As a young man, Francis abandoned a life of comfort to live according to the Gospel. He is the founder of the Franciscan Order and is known for his humility and love of creation.

6) BL. CHIARA BADANO (1971-1990)
Dying of cancer at the age of 18, Chiara stood out for her joy and dedication to God's will. She inspired many with her unshakable faith amid suffering.

7) ST. JOAN OF ARC (1412-1431)
St. Joan of Arc, the young peasant woman who became a military leader and heroine in France, was martyred at age 19. She is known for her courage and deep faith.

8) ST. CARLO ACUTIS (1991-2006)
Known as the patron saint of computer programmers and youth, Carlo used technology to evangelize. He developed a website cataloging all the Eucharistic miracles in the world. He died of leukemia at age 15.

9) ST. ALOYSIUS GONZAGA (1568-1591)
St. Aloysius Gonzaga renounced noble life to become a Jesuit. He is known for his purity and charity, dying at the age of 23 while caring for victims of an epidemic.

IN THE WORDS OF ST. JOHN PAUL II: "DO NOT BE AFRAID TO BE SAINTS." Like these young saints, we are also called to lives of love, service, and holiness. May their stories inspire us to respond to that call with respect, humbleness, courage and joy.
