By living out His Gospel, we help to shape a society with greater respect for human life, economic and environmental justice, cultural diversity, and global solidarity, so that we will build a church where everyone feels welcome and through it will find happiness and salvation.

Why is the cross so important? What do we see in it? Is it offensive? Yes it is because it reminds us we keep crucifying Jesus in our hearts every time we sin. Is it joyful? Yes it is because it reminds us how much God loves us—he loves us so much he was willing to die for us on the cross. Is it our calling? Yes it is because it is God calling us to live our lives as a sacrifice of self-giving love just like Jesus. What is the sacrificial power of the cross? The second reading reminds us that Jesus Christ made the ultimate sacrifice of self-giving love for us. Even though he was equal to God, he freely emptied himself of all that power in order to become a weak human being like us. And the most shocking thing about that is the degree to which he humbled himself and became obedient—to death on the cross. But it was in that ultimate self-giving sacrifice that God super-exalted Jesus, so that when his name is mentioned every knee should bend. That was the victory of love over evil. That was the victory of life over death. And because of that victory, all our suffering has been transformed. Now suffering has a purpose. We can achieve salvation by joining our suffering to Jesus Christ's suffering on the cross for the salvation of the world. Jesus Christ passed through the cross to the resurrection. Now it is our turn. Now we are going to pass through the cross to the resurrection.

We will pass through the cross to the resurrection every time we go to confession. There we will encounter the power of the cross that turns our suffering into tears into joy. Yes we have fallen. Yes, we have sinned. But when we repent, we will encounter the love and mercy of a God who loves us with an everlasting love.

And we will pass through the cross to the resurrection every time we participate in the sacrifice of the mass. It is going to happen right now. We are going to have a spiritual encounter with the power of cross right there, on that altar—in the sacrifice of the Holy Eucharist -- when the bread and wine are transformed into the real body and blood of Jesus Christ.

But not only that. We are going to come up to receive holy communion—the real body and blood of Jesus Christ. When we do, we are going to consume and encounter the power of the holy cross inside of us. It is going to resurrect us. It is going to redeem us, save us, and turn us into Jesus Christ.

Then our real work is going to begin. Because now we have to walk out through those doors and into the world as disciples of Jesus Christ. Our mission will be for every person we meet to encounter the power of the holy cross inside of us. Now we are going to help everyone we can, pass through the cross to the resurrection.

How? By living our lives as a sacrifice of self-giving and self-emptying love, just like Jesus Christ on the cross.

¿Por qué la cruz es tan importante? ¿Qué vemos en ella? ¿Es ofensivo? Sí lo es porque nos recuerda que seguimos crucificando a Jesús en nuestros corazones cada vez que pecamos. Es maravilloso? Sí lo es porque nos recuerda lo tanto que Dios nos ama—que nos ama tanto que fue dispuesto a morir en la cruz por nosotros. ¿Es nuestro llamado? Sí lo es porque Dios nos llama a vivir nuestras vidas como un sacrificio—dando el amor de si mismos—como lo hizo Jesús. ¿Qué es el poder del sacrificio de la cruz? La segunda lectura nos recuerda que Jesucristo hizo el último sacrificio de amarnos—dándonos de si mismo. A pesar de que era igual a Dios, voluntariamente se despojó de todo ese poder para convertirse en un débil ser humano como nosotros. Y lo más increíble fue el grado en que se humilló a sí mismo, y se hizo obediente—hasta la muerte en la cruz.

Pero fue en ese último sacrificio—dando de si mismo—que Dios lo super-exalte a Jesús para que al mencionar su nombre todos doblen la rodilla. Esa fue la victoria del amor sobre el mal. Esa fue la victoria de la vida sobre la muerte. Y por causa de esa victoria, todo el sufrimiento se ha transformado. Ahora el sufrimiento tiene un propósito. Podemos lograr la salvación cuando unimos nuestro sufrir con el sufrir de Jesucristo en la cruz por la salvación del mundo. Jesucristo pasó a través de la cruz a la resurrección. Ahora es nuestro turno. Ahora nosotros vamos a pasar a través de la cruz a la resurrección.

Vamos a pasar a través de la cruz a la resurrección cada vez que vamos a confesión. Allí vamos a tener un encuentro con el poder de la cruz que convierte a nuestro sufrimiento en lágrimas en alegría. Sí, hemos caído. Sí, hemos pecado. Pero cuando nos arrepentimos, vamos a tener un encuentro con el amor y la misericordia de un Dios que nos ama con un amor eterno.

Y vamos a pasar a través de la cruz a la resurrección cada vez que participamos en el sacrificio de la misa. Nos va a pasar ahora mismo. Vamos a tener un encuentro espiritual con el poder de la cruz allí mismo, en ese altar—en el sacrificio de la Santa Eucaristía—cuando el pan y el vino se convierten en el verdadero cuerpo y sangre de Jesucristo. Pero no sólo eso. Vamos a venir a recibir la Sagrada Comunión —el verdadero cuerpo y sangre de Jesucristo. Cuando lo hacemos, vamos a consumir y tener un encuentro con el poder de la santa cruz dentro de nosotros. Nos va a resucitar. Nos va a redimir, salvar, y convertirnos en Jesucristo. Entonces nuestro trabajo verdadero va a empezar. Porque ahora tenemos que caminar a través de esas puertas fuera al mundo como discípulos de Jesucristo. Nuestra misión va a ser que cada persona con que nos encontramos va a tener un encuentro con el poder de la santa cruz dentro de nosotros.

Ahora vamos a ayudar a todos los que podemos, a pasar a través de la cruz a la resurrección. ¿Cómo? Al vivir nuestras vidas como un sacrificio dando de si mismos como Jesucristo en la cruz.




