Our Mission - We, as members of Our Lady of the Desert Church, through the guidance of our Blessed Mother Mary, are a community of believers in Jesus Christ, from whom we have the mission of making His Gospel alive in our parish and in the world. By living out His Gospel, we help to shape a society with greater respect for human life, economic and environmental justice, cultural diversity, and global solidarity, so that we will build a church where everyone feels welcome and through it will find happiness and salvation.

Nuestra Misión - Nosotros, como miembros de la Iglesia de Nuestra Señora del Desierto, con la dirección de Nuestra Madre María, somos una comunidad de creencia en Jesús Cristo, que tenemos la misión de hacer su evangelio vivo en nuestra parroquia y en el mundo. Viviendo su evangelio, ayudamos a formar una sociedad con mayor respecto a la vida humana, a la economía y justicia al ambiente, diversidad cultural, y la solidaridad global, de modo que construyamos una iglesia donde todos se sientan bienvenidos con felicidad y salvación.

What is the cost and sacrifice of discipleship? We have to completely surrender our heart to Jesus. And we cannot do it just once. We have to make it a habit. Day by day, over and over again, we have to do three things: (1) Jesus always comes first. (2) Possessions always come last. And (3) carry your cross.

What do they mean? What does it mean to say Jesus always comes first? It means our love for Jesus has to be more important than even the love we have for our family and for our self. What does it mean to say possessions always come last? It means we must be willing to give up all our possessions so that we may be possessed by Jesus Christ.

What does it mean to carry our cross? It means 2 things: make a sacrifice and make a gift to God. The cross as a sacrifice is choosing to become like Jesus in everything we say and do. It can be spelled out using the letters EWTN: E: Encounter, means going out into the world and searching for people in need, and then bringing them to Jesus one day, one person at a time. W: Washing Feet, means humbling ourselves and denying ourselves, to serve others. T: Table Fellowship, means that our love should include everyone, the unwanted and the poor. N: No Boundary means we need to reach out beyond our comfort zone to forgive those who offend us. The cross as a gift is when we are willing to suffer for God. It means even when we are suffering, we will keep loving God. Let's look at our model of Jesus on Calvary.

Jesus was abandoned by his friends. He was betrayed by Judas. He was innocent but he was condemned to die a shameful death. To the world his mission looked like a complete failure. Worst of all he bore the guilt of our sins. On Calvary, on that very cross, we can almost feel Jesus' suffering, when he cried out "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" There was no answer. And despite all that suffering, He still loved us, and he forgave us. He said "Father, forgive them; for they do now know what they are doing." And in all that suffering, right before He died, he looked up to heaven and said those most beautiful words of love: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." And then he died. This is the gift of Calvary. Jesus not only offered his pain and suffering for the salvation of humankind as a gift to God. Jesus also offered God the ultimate gift of Calvary--that despite all the pain and suffering, abandonment and betrayal, He still loved us, and He still loved God. Can we do the same thing? When we are in pain and suffering can we offer it for the salvation of mankind as a gift to God? And can we make it our gift of Calvary-- that despite all the pain and suffering, abandonment and betrayal, we still love our fellow human beings, and we still love God and Jesus Christ? These are the requirements for discipleship, and they are the same requirements for saving our soul. It may be demanding, but it is not impossible, because with God everything is possible. And if we do the best we can, God and Jesus will do the rest.

¿Cuál es el costo y el sacrificio de ser un discípulo? Hay que entregar por completo nuestro corazón a Jesús. Y no podemos hacerlo sólo una vez. Tenemos que hacerlo un hábito. Día tras día, una y otra vez, tenemos que hacer tres cosas: (1) Jesús siempre es lo primero. (2) Posesiones siempre son lo último. Y (3) carga tu cruz. ¿Qué quiere decir eso? ¿Qué significa decir que Jesús siempre es lo primero? Significa que nuestro amor a Jesús tiene que ser más importante que hasta el amor que tenemos para nuestra familia y para nosotros mismos. ¿Qué significa decir que posesiones siempre son lo último? Significa que tenemos que estar dispuestos a renunciar a todas nuestras posesiones, para que podamos ser poseidos por Jesucristo. ¿Qué significa cargar tu cruz? Significa dos cosas: has un sacrificio y has un regalo a Dios. El sacrificio de la cruz, es escoger ser como Jesús en todo lo que decimos y hacemos. Se puede explicar usando las letras ELMS: E: Encuentro, es salir al mundo para buscar personas con necesidad, y luego traerlos a Jesús, un día, una persona a la vez. L: Lavar los pies, es humillarnos y negarnos a nosotros mismos, para servir a los demás. M: Mesa de comunidad, es amar a todos, hasta los no deseados y los pobres. S: Sin límite, es extendernos fuera de nuestra zona de comodidad para perdonar a los que nos ofenden.

El regalo de la cruz, es cuando estamos dispuestos a sufrir por Dios. Significa que hasta cuando estamos sufriendo, vamos a seguir amando a Dios. Vamos a ver nuestro modelo de Jesús en el Calvario. Jesús fue abandonado por sus amigos. Fue traicionado por Judas. Era inocente, pero fue condenado a morir una muerte vergonzosa. Para el mundo su misión parecía como un fracaso completo. Lo peor de todo es que cargo la culpa de nuestros pecados

En el Calvario, en esa misma cruz, casi se puede sentir el sufrimiento de Jesús, cuando gritó "Dios mío, Dios mío, ¿por qué me has abandonado?" No se contestó. Y a pesar de todo ese sufrimiento, todavía nos amó y nos perdonó. Dijo: "Padre, perdónalos, porque no saben lo que están haciendo." Y en todo ese sufrimiento, antes de morir, miró hacia el cielo y dijo las palabras más hermosas de amor: "Padre, en tus manos encomiendo mi espíritu." Y luego murió.

Este es el regalo del Calvario. Jesús no sólo ofreció su dolor y sufrimiento por la salvación de la humanidad como un regalo a Dios. Jesús también le ofreció a Dios el don supremo del Calvario - que a pesar de todo el dolor y el sufrimiento, el abandono y la traición, Él todavía nos amaba y él todavía amaba a Dios. Podemos hacer lo mismo? Cuando estamos en dolor y sufriendo podemos ofrecerlo por la salvación de la humanidad como un regalo de Dios? Y podemos hacerlo nuestro regalo del Calvario--que a pesar de todo el dolor y el sufrimiento, el abandono y la traición, todavía amamos a nuestros hermanos y hermanas, y todavía amamos a Dios ya Jesucristo. Esto es lo que se necesita para ser un discípulo. Y es lo mismo que se necesita para salvar nuestra alma. Puede ser, que es exigente, pero no es imposible, porque con Dios todo es posible. Y si hacemos lo mejor que podemos, Dios y Jesús harán lo demás.






