"Alleluia! He has risen!" We have the power! Let us use our lives to share the good news with the whole world that Jesus Christ has risen.

Imagine what it must have felt like for Mary Magdala. She went to the tomb and Jesus was gone. Suddenly, at the same time she is utterly confused, scared to death, and bursting with joy. Is it possible? She runs breathless, filled with a superhuman power of hope. We can hear her heart pounding and bursting with joy. We see tears of joy running down her cheeks past her upturned ecstatic smile. Can it be? Alleluia He has Risen!

Like Mary Magdala who ran to tell Peter and John that Jesus was risen, let's tell the whole world with our lives that Jesus has risen for us.

We are the people of the resurrection. Let us prove it in everything we say and do. Let our testimony be the Holy Spirit of the Risen Christ in our hearts. This Holy Spirit gives us the faith, hope, and love to believe that when we die we will be resurrected into a new life with God and Christ. And this experience was a gift God just gave me. So let us receive God's love and share it with others. Let us give up our own interests to live for others. Let us forgive those who offend us even when they don't ask for it. Let us love God just because we love God and for no other reason. Each and every time we make these small gifts to God, we will begin resurrecting our own soul right now in the life we are living. What will it be like when we are resurrected? I don't know. The experts say we will be like Jesus who could walk through walls but he could eat and he could be felt. It means we will be part spirit and part flesh. And Jesus wasn't recognized at first by the disciples who saw him. It means we will probably be able to choose what we look like. We will keep all our experiences and whatever we learned with us. But we will not have the desires and passions that tempted us with sin. We will never be sad, lonely, depressed, worried, angry, jealous, or lazy.

We will finally be at peace & happy with all our loved ones and in God's love.

Mission of Light Column Lenten Excerpts for 2024: EASTER SUNDAY

Tenebrae is a term from the Latin for “darkness”, used to signify the combination of Matins and Lauds for Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday in the ...Divine Office, which were celebrated on the evening before these days...this custom became stylized, so that a candle stand (often called a “hearse”) for fifteen candles (the number of Psalms prayed each day) was used, one candle being extinguished after each Psalm was sung. The main focus during these services was on Christ’s suffering, death, and descent among the dead. *Our Sunday’s Visitor’s Encyclopedia*, Rev. Peter M.J. Stravinskas, Ph.D., S.T.L., Editor, page 925. ...the large triangular candle stand is placed near the altar. The fifteen candles it holds and the six that are on the altar, are of yellow wax, as in the Office for the Dead. All the candles are eventually extinguished except for the one on top of the triangle. It is taken and hidden behind the altar while prayers are recited. When this is finished, a noise is made with seats of the stalls in the choir, which continues until the candle is brought from behind the altar and shows, by its light that the Office of *Tenebrae* is over. *The Liturgical Year*, Vol. 6, Abbot Guéranger, O.S.B.,page. 301. *The Glorified Body*. Theologians describe “heaven” more precisely as the “beatific vision.” Regarding the primary and essential object of the beatific vision, Fr. Reginald Garrigou-Lagrange teaches: “The blessed see clearly and intuitively God Himself as He is in Himself, that is, they see His essence, His attributes, and the three divine persons. The Council of Florence says; ‘They see clearly Himself, one and three, as He is’... They see the eternal generation of the Word, who is the splendor of the Father, figure of His substance. They see the ineffable spiration of the Holy Spirit, who is the terminus of the mutual love of the Father and the Son, who unites the Father and the Son in the most intimate and mutual self-communication.” The blessed also see, in God, the humanity of Christ, the Blessed Virgin Mary, the other members of the Church triumphant, and many other things besides...Moreover, the blessed understand these matters as part of the Triune God’s eternal plan, and they see these things from the vantage point of His infinite wisdom, justice and mercy. ...with the exceptions of our Lord and our Lady, the human natures in heaven right now are not complete, but partial. Put otherwise, besides the God-Man and the Blessed Virgin Mary, the other blessed who had complete human natures while alive on earth presently subsist only in their immortal souls, as they now lack their human bodies. But, as St Thomas Aquinas makes clear, these same blessed do desire to subsist in their bodies once again in order that they may participate, not more intensively, but more extensively, in the greatest of all goods....St. Paul explains in 1 Cor. 15:44-46; 49-50, ‘It is sown a physical body, it is raised a spiritual body...flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable’.

From passages like this, theologians distinguish four main qualities belonging to a glorified body. These are impassibility, agility, subtility, and clarity, and these qualities help us to understand, among other things, what St. Paul means...Briefly, Fr. Garrigou-Lagrange explains each: ‘Impassibility is the gift which preserves not only from death, but also from pain. It arises from the perfect submission of the body to the soul. Agility delivers bodies from heaviness which weighs them down in the present life. The risen body can go where the soul pleases, with a swiftness and ease which St. Jerome compares to that of an eagle. Subtlety renders the body capable of penetrating other bodies without difficulty. Thus, the glorious body of the risen Christ entered the Cenacle though the doors were closed. Clarity gives to the body of the saints that brightness, that splendor, which is the very essence of the beautiful... This clarity is but a reflection, an overflowing, of the glory of the soul on that of the body. Hence, the bodies of the saints will not all have the same degree of clarity, but each will have the degree proportioned to its light of glory.’” By Dr. David Arias, Professor of Philosophy, Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary,”Meménto Newsletter, Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter, April 2024


