

By living out His Gospel, we help to shape a society with greater respect for human life, economic and environmental justice, cultural diversity, and global solidarity, so that we will build a church where everyone feels welcome and through it will find happiness and salvation.

This is our story about what is happening to us right now, as we pass through the cross to the resurrection. And our journey of passing through the cross, we will change us into Jesus Christ.

First there will be joy. Jesus entered Jerusalem the same way he enters our hearts. The crowds welcomed their new king Jesus by laying palm branches and even their clothes on the road in front of him. Jesus had awakened the faith, hope, and love in the hearts of the humble, the poor, the forgotten, and those who do not matter in the world. We too wave our palms and welcome our new king Jesus.

We felt joy like that when we were baptized. We felt joy like that in our conversion. We welcomed Jesus as our new king, into our hearts. Our hearts were burning with love for Jesus who walks with us--who is our friend, our brother, and our king, who loves us. Then suddenly everything changes.

There comes the cross. Jesus entered Jerusalem to die on the cross. And Jesus enters into our hearts to die with us to our self-interests and to sin. What kind of king is he? He entered Jerusalem as a suffering servant, humbled, riding on a donkey, and obedient to God. He will receive a crown of thorns. His royal throne will be made with the wood of the cross. And he will die in shame and abandoned nailed to the cross like a common criminal. Why? Why? Why?

Because the ultimate price had to be paid for the ultimate crime of all our sins against God. The ultimate sacrifice of suffering and death on the cross had to be made for the victory of love over sin and death.

And so the joy of the palms was turned into the sorrow of the cross. Step by step every human reason for loving and trusting in God was taken away. Jesus suffered the fear and agony in the garden. Judas betrayed Jesus for 30 pieces of silver. Jesus was arrested. Peter denied Jesus. All the disciples abandoned him.

That is our new mission: We have to die to ourselves (our selfishness and sinful ways). And We have to carry the cross for others by loving God in them. That is God's greatest commandment: Love one another as I have loved you. How can we do that?

First we have to forgive those who offend us. After Jesus was humiliated, tortured, and crucified, and while he was dying on the cross he said "Father forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing (Lk. 23:34).

They didn't ask to be forgiven, Jesus forgave them anyway. We have to do the same thing. When someone offends us, even if they don't ask us to forgive them, we must forgive them. Then we have to share the love we receive from God with others. How can we do that? We have to reach out and help the poor, the sick, the homeless, the unemployed, the depressed, the suicidal, the drug addicts, the alcoholics, the imprisoned, and anyone else who is unwanted by the world and needs our help.

La multitud dieron la bienvenida a su nuevo rey Jesús tirando ramas y ropa en el camino delante de él. Jesús despertó la fe, la esperanza y el amor en los corazones de los humildes, los pobres, los olvidados y los que no importan en el mundo. Nosotros también usamos las ramas para dar la bienvenida a nuestro nuevo rey Jesús.

Sentimos alegría así cuando fuimos bautizados. Sentimos alegría así cuando nos convertimos. Dimos la bienvenida a Jesús como nuestro nuevo rey, en nuestros corazones. Nuestros corazones estaban ardiendo de amor por Jesús que camina con nosotros--que es nuestro amigo, nuestro hermano y nuestro rey, que nos ama. Entonces, de repente todo cambia.

Viene la cruz. Jesús entró en Jerusalén para morir en la cruz. Y Jesús entra en nuestros corazones, para morir con nosotros a nuestros propios intereses y al pecado. ¿Qué tipo de rey es él? Él entró en Jerusalén como un siervo sufriente, humillado, montado en un burro, y obediente a Dios. Va recibir una corona de espinas. Su trono va ser hecha con la madera de la cruz. Y va a morir con vergüenza y abandonado, clavado en la cruz como un criminal.

¿Por qué? ¿Por qué? ¿Por qué?

Porque se tuvo que pagar el precio máximo por el crimen máximo de todos nuestros pecados contra Dios. Se tuvo que hacer el sacrificio máximo de sufrir y morir en la cruz para la victoria del amor sobre el pecado y la muerte.

Así que la alegría de los ramos se convirtió en el dolor de la cruz. Paso a paso cada razón humana para amar y confiar en Dios fue eliminada. Jesús sufrió el miedo y la agonia en el huerto. Judas lo traicionó por 30 monedas de plata. Jesús fue arrestado. Pedro lo negó. Todos los discípulos lo abandonaron. Esa es nuestra nueva misión: tenemos que morir a nosotros mismos (a nuestras formas egoístas y pecaminosas). Y tenemos que cargar la cruz por los demás, amando a Dios en ellos. Es el más grande mandamiento de Dios: Que se amen unos a otros como yo los he amado. ¿Cómo podemos hacer eso? Primero tenemos que perdonar a los que nos ofenden. Después de que Jesús fue humillado, torturado y crucificado, y cuando estaba muriendo en la cruz, dijo: "Padre, perdónalos, porque no saben lo que hacen" (Lk. 23:34). No pidieron el perdón, comoquiera Jesús los perdonó. Tenemos que hacer lo mismo. Cuando alguien nos ofende, hasta cuando no nos piden el perdón, tenemos que perdonarlos.

Entonces tenemos que compartir el amor que recibimos de Dios con los demás. ¿Cómo podemos hacer eso? Tenemos que extender la mano y ayudar a los pobres, los enfermos, los destituidos, los desempleados, los deprimidos, los que quieren suicidarse, los drogadictos, los alcohólicos, los encarcelados, y cualquier otra persona que el mundo no quiere y que necesita de nuestra ayuda.
