By living out His Gospel, we help to shape a society with greater respect for human life, economic and environmental justice, cultural diversity, and global solidarity, so that we will build a church where everyone feels welcome and through it will find happiness and salvation.

Jesus tells a parable: There was a rich man, dressed in fine clothes and living in luxury. And lying at his door, there was a hungry beggar, named Lazarus, with nobody to help him except the dogs that licked his sores. Then there was a reversal of destinies. Poor Lazarus died and was carried by angels into Abraham's embrace (heaven). The rich man died, but instead of going into Abraham's embrace, he went into Hades (Hell).

God tired to help him. God sent him poor Lazarus as an opportunity to open his door, to help him, and to save his soul. But the rich man refused. He loved money too much. He loved money so much it gave him a hardened heart. He became deaf to the cry of the poor. And he failed to help him. His sin was the sin of indifference and omission.

With that sin of omission, the rich man died. And in death he finally discovered the truth that was staring him in the face all along: the purpose of life is to "Love one another as I have loved you." And now it was too late.

So the rich man begged Abraham: "I beg you, father, send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they too come to this place of torment." Abraham's reply is clear: "They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them." In other words, the Law and the Prophets made it perfectly clear that we have a covenant with God in which each of us is obligated to share what we have with the poor and outcasts.

But the rich man knew this wasn't enough. He said "O no, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent." He was begging for a miracle. He was begging for a resurrection. Sadly Abraham responded: "If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead."

I stopped to think and I said to myself: "*Wait a minute. This did happen. Jesus you rose from the dead. And it still wasn't enough. People still refuse to repent and believe in you. People still refuse to open the door of their hearts to all the Lazarus's in the world.*"

How can we open the door for the poor Lazarus's all around us? St. Paul tells us to seek righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness; and to keep the commandment until the appearance of our Lord Jesus Christ. What does that mean? It means we are called to live Jesus' compassion and action. Like Jesus, we need to reach out and help anyone in need in any way we can. And that...is how we give glory to our God.

Jesús cuenta una parábola: Había un hombre rico, vestido con ropa fina y viviendo en el lujo. Y, echado en su puerta, había un mendigo hambriento, llamado Lázaro, quien nadie ayudaba, excepto los perros que se acercaban a lamerle las llagas. Entonces el destino se volteó al revés. El pobre Lázaro murió y los ángeles lo llevaron al seno de Abraham (El Cielo). El hombre rico murió, pero en vez de ir al seno de Abraham, fue al Hades (El Infierno).

Dios trató de ayudarlo. Dios le mandó el pobre Lázaro como una oportunidad para abrir la puerta, para ayudarlo, y para salvar su alma. Pero el rico se negó. Amaba el dinero demasiado. Amaba el dinero tanto que le endureció el corazón. Se hizo sordo al llanto de los pobres. Y falló en ayudarlo. Su pecado fue el pecado de la indiferencia y omisión.

Con ese pecado de omisión, el rico murió. Y en la muerte, por fin descubrió la verdad que siempre estuvo en frente de él: el propósito de la vida es cuando Jesús dijo "que se amen unos a otros como yo los he amado." Y ahora era demasiado tarde.

Así que el hombre rico le rogó a Abraham: "Te ruego, entonces, padre, Abraham, que mandes a Lázaro a mi casa, pues me quedan allá cinco hermanos, para que les advierta y no acaben también ellos en este lugar de tormentos". La respuesta de Abraham fue clara: "Tienen a Moisés y a los profetas; que los escuchen." Es decir, la Ley y los Profetas lo hicieron perfectamente claro que tenemos un convenio con Dios, en la que cada uno de nosotros tiene la obligación de compartir lo que tenemos con los pobres y desechados.

Pero el rico sabía que no era suficiente. Dijo: "¡No, padre Abraham. Si un muerto va a decírselo, entonces si se arrepentirán. Estaba rogando por un milagro. Estaba rogando por una resurrección. Con tristeza Abraham le respondió: "Si no escuchan a Moisés y a los profetas, no harán caso, ni aunque resucite un muerto".

Me puse a pensar y me dije: "*Espera un minuto. Esto si paso. Jesús, tu resucitaste de entre los muertos. Y todavía no fue suficiente. La gente todavía se niegan a arrepentirse y creer en ti. La gente todavía se niegan a abrir la puerta de su corazón para todos los Lazares en el mundo*". ¿Cómo podemos abrir la puerta para los pobres Lazares al rededor de nosotros? San Pablo nos dice que debemos llevar una vida de justicia, piedad, fe, amor, paciencia, mansedumbre, y cumplir todo lo mandado, hasta la venida de nuestro Señor Jesucristo.

Qué significa eso? Significa que estamos llamados a vivir la compasión y acción de Jesús. Como Jesús, tenemos que extender la mano y ayudar a todos con necesidad en todo lo que podamos. Y así...le daremos gloria a nuestro Dios.


