



ORDINANCE 2026-018

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE VILLAGE POLICY FOR MAILBOXES LOCATED WITHIN THE STREET RIGHT OF WAY.

WHEREAS, there is a need for private mailboxes to be located within the right-of-way of the Village, and

WHEREAS, said mailboxes if improperly installed could pose a condition that may be hazardous to the safety, health and welfare of pedestrians, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Jackson Center has determined the location of mailboxes in the street right-of-way should be discouraged, especially if the installation needs to be on an existing sidewalk, but when the need arises, the installation must be approved by the Village of Jackson Center.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF JACKSON CENTER, SHELBY COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO

SECTION 1.

All mailboxes that shall be erected within the boundaries of any right-of-way of the Village of Jackson Center require an installation permit from the Village of Jackson Center. The installation permit of a mailbox requires a signed guarantee delivery as determined by the United States Postal Service. The permit fee for an installation in the grass utility strip is Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00). If the mailbox is to be attached to a new or existing sidewalk, the permit fee is One Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars (\$125.00).

SECTION 2.

Mailboxes shall not be installed on and within sidewalks measuring less than forty-eight (48") wide with the exception of hardship cases as determined by the United States Postal Service. Any installation on a sidewalk less than sixty inches (60") wide, the mailbox must allow thirty-six inches (36") of clearance to comply with ADA guidelines.

SECTION 3.

Mailboxes shall be placed within the utility strip if one exists, located between the curb and sidewalk, as permitted under the conditions described herein.

SECTION 4.

Mailboxes will be at least forty-two inches from the street to the bottom of the mailbox and mounted on a break-away post not larger than four inches by four inches. Said mail box will have dimensions that do not exceed twelve inches wide, twelve inches tall and twenty-four



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inches deep. All mailboxes shall be approved per USPS regulations and specifications. Any damage to public property which may occur during the installation or removal of a mailbox shall be repaired at the abutting property owner's expense. Failure to repair within ninety (90) days will result in the repairs being made by the Village, and the costs, including labor, materials, and administrative costs, assessed to the property owner.

SECTION 5.

All mailboxes remain the property and liability of the property owner. Any damage to an installation within the Village Right of Way remains the responsibility of the property owner to replace or repair. This includes, but is not limited to, damage due to snow removal, street maintenance, accidents, or acts of vandalism. For any installation on the sidewalk, any damage that occurs to the concrete shall be repaired to the Village of Jackson Center standards before any reinstallation of the mailbox. If the concrete is not repaired within ninety (90) days, the Village will repair or replace the concrete and assess the property owner for the repairs or replacement costs, including labor, materials, and administrative costs.

SECTION 6.

Ordinance 2003-06, passed January 13, 2003, is hereby repealed and replaced by this ordinance.

SECTION 7.

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force after its adoption by Council, approval by the Mayor, and the earliest period allowed by law.
