About Jackson Center

The Village of Jackson Center is the fourth largest municipality in Shelby County, Ohio. Jackson Center is continuing to see

residential and commercial growth, while maintaining a strong industrial base and yet continues to preserve the small town feeling that we all love.

In the last five years, the village has expanded and/or improved the water treatment and wastewater treatment plants. This allows us to continue to offer lower utility rates than the surrounding communities. In addition, Jackson Center provides an ISO fire rating of 4 which provides lower insurance premiums. Utilities and services available in Jackson Center include water, sewer, electric, leaf pickup, limb pickup, curbside recycling, sidewalks, and street lights.

Location

Jackson Center is located at the intersection of State Route 274 and State Route 65 in the northeast part of Shelby County.

The village is within 7 miles of I-75, 8 miles of Indian Lake, 11 miles of US 33, 15 miles of Wapakoneta, and 15 miles of Sidney.

Housing

The Village of Jackson Center currently has four new residential subdivisions offering new home building sites and newly constructed homes. There is also new housing actively under construction.

Residential Tax Abatement

The Village of Jackson Center offers a 100% tax abatement for five years for the construction new single-family of residential housing 100% and tax abatement for five years for remodeling (\$8,000+)single-family residential of housing through Community Reinvestment Program.

Education

Jackson Center Local School District is located in northeast Shelby County. The district has one large building complex which houses 550 students on average in grades pre-K-12, with 42 certified staff members.

The district provides an innovative curriculum and schedule for elementary and middle school children that is designed to fit the individual needs of all students. For example, our teachers specialize in subjects starting at the



kindergarten level so even 5 and 6 yr olds change classes during the day.

At the high school level, Jackson Center is the only school in Shelby County besides Sidney High School that offers Advanced Placement classes. In addition, Jackson Center School offers Dual Enrollment courses through Urbana University.

The Jackson Center community takes pride in its school district and shows support financially through booster groups and volunteering. The school district participates in the inter-district open enrollment program and many students from surrounding school districts choose to attend our school. In conjunction with the Upper Valley JVS, we offer comprehensive Vocational Consumer Sciences and Vocational Agriculture programs.

Students from Jackson Center have distinguished themselves with their achievements and accomplishments. Students take academic studies seriously with a high percentage moving on to higher education. Our students have also done well in music competitions, art contests, athletic events, and drama productions. Our teachers and support staff do all that is possible to provide an environment that is conducive to student participation and achievement.

Vocational/Technical Education

The Upper Valley Joint Vocational School provides high quality and extensive career and technical training to high school and adult learners.

At the high school level, student success means that each student earns a high school diploma, has the career and technical training and credentials that will make him or her ready for the workforce, is able to access post-secondary educational options, and understands the value of being a contributing member of the The JVS serves over 800 community. students at the Main Campus and another 2200 in satellite programs housed in many of the 14 associate school districts, including Jackson Center Local Schools. The JVS offers more than 30 programs. Students get a jump start on their career and start to earn college credits while in high school.

The Adult Division serves over 3000 adults in a variety of program options including short term skill specific classes, extended training and credentialing programs, and customized courses developed to meet the

needs of individuals or employers. The Adult Division is associated with the University System of Ohio under the Board of Regents and enables adults to start earning credits for a college degree as well as receive training necessary to advance in current employment or start a new career - while staying close to home and in a cost effective manner. In addition, the JVS provides classes for individuals who need to refresh their reading and math literacy skills or earn a GED.

Higher Education

The following higher education opportunities are available, all within easy driving distance:

Edison State Community College (Piqua), Ohio State University (Lima), University of Northwestern Ohio (Lima), Rhodes College (Lima), and Wright State University, Lake Campus.

Recreation

The Village of Jackson Center is proud to offer 2 municipal parks for our residents o enjoy. An 8 acre park located on the east side of town at the corner of State Route 274 (E. Pike Street) and Parkview Drive features a newly remodeled municipal pool for 2020 with a spray park and a zero The park also includes covered shelter houses, restrooms, picnic areas, two lighted tennis courts, two lighted pickle ball courts (new for 2020), three basketball courts, and new playground equipment. A recent addition is an 83 acre municipal park located in the southwest portion of the village and is accessible from State Route 65 (S. Main Street). This park features 3 full size, irrigated soccer fields, as well as a pee-wee soccer field and practice fields. There is a large paved parking area with a nice paved walking track and wooded area. Future plans for Phase 2 brings many exciting plans for expansion.

Businesses

Jackson Center's large employers include: Airstream, Rising Sun Express, EMI Corp, Equipment, Lacal and **Plastipak** Packaging. Center Jackson possesses several professional services and retail businesses including: a movie theater, medical offices (chiropractic, and family physicians), banking, beauty salon, library, auto repair, gas stations, insurance offices, eateries, several churches and a funeral home just to name a few.

New residents shall establish a post office box in order to obtain mail and utility services.

Per Ordinance 03-06, no new mailboxes shall be erected with the exception of hardship cases as determined by the United States Postal Service. When a property changes ownership or the hardship case ceases, the existing mailbox is to be removed.

Water/Sewer/Electric

Residents need to apply for utility service (water, sewer, electric) at the Village Office at 122 E. Pike Street.

Property owners may present a copy of their deed to avoid paying a utility deposit. Persons renting a facility will need to pay a \$300 deposit before service is established. Utility bills are mailed on the first of each month and are due on or before the 15th of the month. Payment can be mailed, dropped in the night deposit (located at the front of the utility office), or paid during regular business hours at the utility office. A direct payment option is available or payment can be made on our website @www.jacksoncenter.com.

Trash Collection

The Village contracts for residential trash service. Trash collection is every Tuesday, except on major holidays.

Curbside trash collection must be placed in village bags and should be placed at the curb by 6 a.m. Large items require tags. Bags and tags can be purchased at the Village Office. A vending machine for bag purchase is available 24 hours a day at the Village Office.

Bags are available in packets of 10 for \$28.00. The cost of tags depends on the size of the item to be disposed of.



Option two is a 96 gal tote thru Republic Waste Services for \$14.96 a month billed quarterly . Please contact Republic Waste Services at 937-593-3566 to sign up.

With the tote service large items will not require a tag to be picked up.

Recycling Pickup

Residents are encouraged to recycle. Recycling containers are available to every Jackson Center resident. Containers should be placed at the curb for collection with their regular trash pickup every other week. Pickup schedules are published monthly and are available at the Village Office.

Recycling is provided by Republic Waste Services. The recycling fee is included in your monthly utility bill.

Recycling Drop-off

A Recycling Trailer is located at 500 Jerry Drive and is open dawn to dusk. This service is provided at no additional cost to village and township residents.

The site accepts newspapers, magazines, plastic, glass, aluminum, bi-metal cans and cardboard and will not accept any other items. Cardboard must be broken down and flattened and materials shall not be placed outside their appropriate labeled bins.

Yard Waste

Residents may deposit grass clippings at the dumpster located behind the Wastewater Treatment Plant on Jerry Drive.

Limbs can be placed by the curb and will be picked up by Village workers. Residents shall call the Village Office at 937-596-6314 for pickup.

Leaf Collection

Leaf collection occurs from October 1 thru December 1 and is provided as a free service to the residents of Jackson Center. Leaves shall be placed next to the curb, but not in the street. Leaf piles should not contain twigs, sticks, branches, bags, etc.

Street Maintenance

The Street Department handles street maintenance, street cleaning, snow removal, storm drainage, traffic signs, pavement markings, etc.

To report a problem, contact the Village Office at 937-596-6314. For an emergency after hours, such as a traffic signal outage, a stop sign down, etc, contact the Police Department at 937-596-6140 or the Shelby County Sheriff at 937-498-1111.

Snow Removal

Village crews salt and plow the village streets with each storm. You can assist the crews by moving your vehicle(s) off the street.

When you clear your driveway, stack the shoveled snow to the right side of your driveway to reduce the amount of snow plowed in front of your driveway. Do not shovel snow into the street.

Hydrant Flushing

Fire hydrant flushing is done twice a year and is announced in the newsletter and on the village sign. The intent of the hydrant maintenance program is to maintain public fire hydrants in a ready condition through flushing, inspection, lubricating, and cleaning as recommended by the National Fire Protection Association and making any needed repairs.

Due to the fire hydrant flushing, residents could experience a temporary discoloration of water, which is due to the unsettling of sediment in the water main.

If you experience discolored water, run the cold water for about ten minutes - this should clear up the water. Avoid using hot water - this draws the sediment into the hot water tank.

If your clothes have been discolored from the rust, do not dry the clothes. You should re-wash them with a rust removing additive. Free rust removing additive may be obtained from the Village Office at 122 E Pike Street.

Animal Control

All dogs must have a county license which is available at the Shelby County Auditors Office located in the Shelby County Annex, Floor 3 - 129 E. Court St., Sidney. For questions about dog tags, call 937-498-7202. Pets are not permitted to run atlarge in the village. Animals found at-large will be impounded. To report an animal control problem, call the Jackson Center



Police at 937-596-6140 or Shelby County Sheriffs Dept at 937-498-1111.

Auto Tags/Driver's License

New auto tags or driver's license can be obtained from the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles Deputy Registrar, 1000 Milligan Ct, Sidney. For more information, contact the license bureau at 937-497-8247.

Voter Registration

You may register to vote at the Shelby County Board of Elections office at 230 E. Court St, Sidney, Ohio, the Shelby County Bureau of Motor Vehicles at 1000 Milligan Court, Sidney, Ohio, or the Village Office. For more questions, you can contact the Shelby County Board of Elections at 937-498-7207.

Golf Carts

Golf carts are considered a "Motor Vehicle" as defined by Ohio Revised Code 4501.01. A golf cart may not lawfully be operated on public streets or highways unless it satisfies the statutory requirements that are applicable to motor vehicles. For more information on acquiring the necessary license plates to operate the golf cart on public streets, call the Jackson Center Police Department at 937-596-6140. unconventional vehicles that will operated in the village are required to be inspected and issued a Village of Jackson Center Unconventional Vehicle Sticker. This sticker will be valid until 12/31/2024. At that time, vehicle will need to be reinspected and issued a new sticker. There is a \$5.00 fee for the inspection and sticker.

Zoning Regulations

Before constructing a home, building, addition, storage building, fence, pool, sign, or making other improvements to your property, contact the Village Zoning Officer at 937-596-6314 or 937-726-1504 There may be zoning regulations that apply to such improvements.

Building Inspection

For your protection, building permits are required for a variety of items. If you are planning to construct a new building or make a change to your property in the Village, you may obtain all the necessary information and forms at the "one stop" customer service counter at the Sidney-Shelby County Board of Health Office, 202 W Poplar St, Sidney or at the Village Office at 122 E Pike Street.

All new buildings and structures,

alterations, additions, remodeling, demolition, changes in use or other activities connected to construction or development require a building permit. The following items do not require a building permit: siding, re-roofing, landscaping, painting/wallpapering, and storm/screen windows and Residential accessory structures (under 200 sf) do not need a building permit but do need an electrical permit, if applicable.

Zoning approvals are granted by the Village of Jackson Center. This includes: new buildings, patio covers, room additions, fireplace work, chimney work, new or partial basements, electrical, heating and plumbing work, furnace, central air conditioning, hot water heater or water softener installation or replacement, demolition, etc.

Village Income Tax

The Village has a 1.5% income tax. Revenue from this tax is used to finance capital improvements, safety services, and the parks department. Taxes are due on or before April 15th of each year.

Recreational Fires

On May 8, 2006, the Jackson Center Village Council adopted the 2005 Ohio Fire Code. Included in the Ohio Fire Code is the definition of a "Recreational Fire."

A recreational fire is an outdoor fire burning materials other than rubbish where the fuel being burned is not contained in an incinerator, outdoor fireplace, barbeque grill, or barbeque pit and has a total fuel area of 3 feet or less in diameter and 2 feet or less in height for pleasure, religious, ceremonial, cooking, warmth, or similar purposes.

A recreational fire shall not be conducted within 25 feet of a structure or combustible material. Conditions which could cause a fire spread within 25 feet of a structure should be eliminated prior to ignition. The been providing support to our village for recreational fire shall be constantly attended until the fire is extinguished. A minimum of one portable fire extinguisher with a minimum 4-A rating or other fire extinguishing approved on-site equipment, such as dirt, sand, water barrel, garden hose, or water truck shall be available for immediate utilization.

Wally Byam Memorial Park

restrooms, picnic areas, two lighted tennis courts, two lighted pickleball courts (new in 2020) three basketball courts, and new playground equipment.

The park features 2 shelter houses with electric service and are available on a first-come basis or can be reserved thru the village office.

Shelter House #1 has six 10' picnic tables and can accommodate 60 people.

Shelter House #2 has four 10' picnic tables and two 6' picnic tables and can accommodate 52 people.

Tiger Trail Park

Located off of South Main Street (State Route 65) and behind Grace Lutheran Church, Tiger Trail Park is the newest addition to our municipal park system. It includes over 80 acres of possible recreation area and begins with a short, scenic drive down a wooded drive to a large, solar-lit, paved parking area. The park features 3 irrigated soccer fields, a pee-wee soccer field, soccer practice areas and a 3/4 mile paved walking path. Phase 2 expansion holds many exciting possibilities for pleasurable activities and will continue to add to the Village's commitment to providing recreational options for our residents.

Veterans Memorial Park

Located on the corner of Fairview & College St., the Jackson Center Veterans Memorial Park is dedicated to all those who served our nation and made the ultimate sacrifice. It is open year round, and features night lighting. There is a memorial service held at Veterans Park every Memorial Day.

Swimming Pool

The Village of Jackson Center Municipal Pool is located at 800 E Pike Street.

Hours of Operation:

The pool is open daily from 12:00 -8:00 PM June, July and part of August. On evenings, if a pool party is scheduled, the hours will be 12:00 – 5:00 PM.

A sign will be posted at the pool if a pool party is scheduled.

Where to Purchase Season Passes:

Season passes can be purchased at the Village Office during the week between $8:00\ AM-4:00\ PM$. Season passes can

also be purchased by mail or via drop box by submitting a season pool pass application and a check payable to the Village of Jackson Center.

Pool Party:

Pool Parties may be scheduled any evening during the pool season between the hours of 6:00 – 8:00 PM.

Reservations are available on a first-paid, first-served basis. A rental fee of \$200.00 (up to 100 people) is due upon confirmation of date requested. Cancellations must occur at least 72 hours in advance of the date of the pool party for a refund.

Pool party reservations can be made at the Village Office during the week between 8:00 AM – 4:00 PM, or by mail or via drop box by submitting a pool party application and a check payable to the Village of Jackson Center. Confirmation will be made via mail/phone of your reservation.

Gas Aggregation

We are pleased to announce that the Village of Jackson Center has chosen IGS Energy as the gas supplier for the Village of Jackson Center natural gas governmental aggregation program. This program is available for residential and small commercial customers in the Village of Jackson Center.

Jackson Center Village Council passed ordinance #03-07 on February 17, 2003 adopting the Village of Jackson Center natural gas governmental aggregation program after Jackson Center voters approved the implementation of the program.

Under this aggregation, CenterPoint Energy Ohio will continue to maintain the pipeline system that delivers natural gas to your home or business. You will continue to receive a single bill from CenterPoint Energy Ohio for your natural gas service and it will include your new gas supply charge from IGS Energy. You will still contact CenterPoint Energy Ohio regarding loss of gas service, odor of gas, or for any other concerns or issues having to do with your local service. Budget billing and automatic billing options will continue to be available thru CenterPoint Energy Ohio.

For those currently enrolled in the Jackson Center Natural Gas Aggregation Program, please call IGS Energy at 1-877-353-0162 to be enrolled with the new natural gas supplier unless you choose to "opt out" -



that is, to not participate. There is no cost for enrollment.

Those that are not currently enrolled and would like to be included in the program, please call IGS Energy at 1-877-353-0162 to obtain the eligibility requirements and enrollment procedures.

Property Maintenance Compliance

The Village of Jackson Center enforces a property maintenance code to maintain the character of our community.

The code outlines general provisions for property upkeep and applies to all residential, commercial and business properties in the city.

Examples of property maintenance issues include:

- Unlicensed and junk vehicles
- Material storage on property
- Trash, car parts, furniture, appliances and other debris on the property
- Tall grass and weeds
- General maintenance condition of the structures on the property, such as:
 - exterior siding
 - · broken windows
 - gutters and downspouts in disrepair
 - peeling paint
 - roofs, walls or foundations in disrepair
 - deteriorated entrance or storm doors
 - deteriorated sidewalks
 - sheds, garages and fences in disrepair
 - unsanitary conditions on or about the property
