Leininger Lane Nears Completion

Exciting news for our village! The long-awaited Leininger Lane road project is nearly finished and promises to improve connectivity and convenience for our residents. This new public roadway links East Pike Street with Davis Street. In addition to the road itself, the project includes brand-new sidewalks, curb and gutter installations, and several parking stalls to ease congestion and improve accessibility.

As of now, all sidewalk and concrete work is complete. Crews are currently preparing the street base, with paving expected to begin shortly. With a bit of luck—and good weather—Leininger Lane may already be open for public use by the time you read this!

Special thanks to TRG, the Fish Pond Food Pantry and the neighboring area directly affected during this renovation for your patience and support during construction. We look forward to seeing this new addition become a well-used part of our village infrastructure!


