From the desk of the Administrator...

Greetings JC and hello October! Fall is here which means football is back on TV! A lot of great things happen this time of the year. As we close the chapter to the 2025 summer season, I wanted to provide you all with an update about our Water Treatment Plant.

Water Treatment Plant

The Village owns and operates a Class 1 community Public Water System that serves our residents and businesses. The Water Department is led by Braden Lotz and the Village has 3 other employees who are licensed Operators. As a reminder, the Village is currently underway with constructing a new "Ion Exchange" Water Treatment Plant. Following completion, the new Treatment Plant will have a design capacity of 0.72MGD (500 GPM) with room for further expansion to 1.152MGD (800GPM).

What is "Ion Exchange?" Ion Exchange is a water treatment system that removes containments like calcium and magnesium from the water that causes water hardness. I'm sure most of our readers/residents have installed water softeners in their own homes because of the scaling, chalky residues, or their soap not lathering because of how hard our water is in the system. In our efforts to provide safe and reliable water, the Village's new Ion Exchange Water softeners will reduce the hardness to 140mg/I from an average raw water hardness of 427mg/I. (be advised this can change). This new treatment style will bring softer water to your faucet and potentially reduce the amount of salt you have to buy for your own softener.

The project is still on schedule and is looking like the 1st QTR of 2026 for project completion and operation. Contractors are installing the inside work such as electric, plumbing, filters, and much more! Details to come! Crosswalk Safety



In the village, whether walking, biking, driving a car or golf cart-safety is a shared responsibility. With more walkers around town and some reported "near misses", it's a good time to review crosswalk safety and pedestrian right of way. Observing a few extra seconds of patience for crosswalk safety is a simple but powerful way to protect our neighbors.

Pedestrian Right of Way: In Ohio, drivers are **required by law to yield to pedestrians** in marked crosswalks. Even if no stop sign or light is present, vehicles must stop and allow a pedestrian to cross safely once they've stepped into the crosswalk. (**Pedestrians**, too, should use crosswalks whenever available and wait for traffic to stop before crossing).

Tips for Drivers:

- Always slow down near intersections, schools, and parks.
- Be alert for pedestrians stepping out; especially children, older adults and people with disabilities whom may be closer to the ground or take a little slightly longer to cross.
- Never pass another vehicle stopped at a crosswalk—it likely stopped for a pedestrian you cannot see.

Tips for Pedestrians:

- Look both ways before entering the crosswalk, even if you have the right-of-way...even if you have used the electric signal push button.
- Make eye contact with drivers to be sure they see you.
- Walk. don't run across the street.
