# Sermon Notes - Walking in Newness of Life Romans 6:4 (KJV)

## Scripture Focus:

"Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life."

Romans 6:4

### Main Point 1: Buried No More

Explanation: By baptism, we symbolize burial with Christ, dying to the old sinful self. Our old nature is put to death.

Application: Reflect on baptism's significance. Surrender areas where old habits still dominate.

3 Practical Steps:

Renew your baptismal commitment.
Identify & surrender a sinful habit.
Seek accountability.

Example: A believer breaks addiction through full surrender.

Illustration: Seed buried in soil transforms into new life.

Key Scripture: Romans 6:4; Colossians 2:12

## Main Point 2: Raised to Walk in Newness of Life

Explanation: Just as Christ was raised glorious, we are empowered to live daily reflecting His righteousness.

Application: Embrace your new identity; let your thoughts, words, and actions reflect Christ.

3 Practical Steps:

Declare your risen life in Christ daily. Meditate on resurrection scriptures. Serve others to show Christ's love.

Example: A believer chooses forgiveness over bitterness.

Illustration: Butterfly emerging vibrant and free.

Key Scripture: Philippians 3:10-11; Ephesians 2:4-6

## Main Point 3: Walk, Worship, and Witness for Jesus

Explanation: Our new life is to be lived in visible action—in worship, deeds, and sharing faith boldly.

Application: Be a living testimony; share your transformed life and stay faithful in prayer and scripture.

3 Practical Steps:

Renew daily walk with God.

Worship in spirit and truth.

Share your testimony with others.

Example: One who stands firm in trials becomes a bold witness.

Key Scripture: John 11:25-26; 1 Peter 1:3
