FALL CLEAN-UP 2022

Yard Debris and Leaves

The Village of St. Paris Street Department will have fall clean-up October 17 - 21. Please have your yard debris to your curb by Sunday night, October 16, 2021. The Village will begin picking up fall leaves during the month of November. Please rake your leaves to the curb, not in the street. Remove all sticks and debris to prevent the leaf vacuum from breaking down and possibly ending leaf pick up. If you would like to bag your leaves or yard debris for pick up, the Village has large leaf bags for \$2 per bag at the Municipal Building. These bags are available for purchase and pickup all year round.

SUMMER METER PROGRAM

All Summer Meters Are Due Back by November 1, 2022

If you have checked out a summer water meter from the St. Paris Municipal Building, your meter is due back by November 1, 2022. Your sewer account will be credited for the gallons of water you used that did not go through the St. Paris sewer system. The time to check them back out again will start in March 2023.

Prescription Drug Take Back Day is October 29, 2022, 10 AM - 2 PM

The St. Paris Police Department is accepting prescription medications and empty vape cartridges only on Saturday, October 29, 2022, 10:00AM – 2:00PM. No illegal drugs, liquids, needles, inhalers, mercury thermometer, aerosol cans, household hazardous waste or no unmarked acids. Be sure to remove all personal information on your prescription bottle or simply place all pills in a baggy for disposal.

When you're done with prescription medicine, it's easy to forget about it as it sits unused in a drawer or medicine cabinet. Keeping unneeded medicine in the house is not a good idea, as it can harm children, pets, teens, and adults if accidentally ingested or misused.
