The FOMAS Impact: One Year in as Executive Director

Dear Supporters,

As I reflect on my first year as Executive Director of Friends of Metro Animal Services (FOMAS), I am proud of the meaningful strides we've made in supporting the animals and people who rely on Metro Animal Services (MAS). This role has been

both humbling and energizing, as I've witnessed firsthand the generosity of our community and the dedication of our partners. Together, we've worked to ensure that compassion, not cost, has been at the forefront of our work.

Among our most impactful achievements was providing over \$85,000 in redemption fees, allowing pet owners to reclaim their animals without financial hardship. We also approved \$25,000 in funding for the development of a new play yard at MAS, which will enrich the lives of shelter animals by giving them space to exercise, socialize, and simply be dogs. Additionally, our commitment to community wellness led us to approve a \$60,000 Medical Voucher Program, which has helped pet owners access critical veterinary care.



We've also prioritized the tools and resources MAS needs to operate effectively. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we raised nearly \$15,000 to purchase surgical packs, an incubator, and an autoclave. These accomplishments are a testament to what we can achieve when we come together around a shared mission. I'm incredibly grateful for the support I've received in this first year and look forward to continuing to grow FOMAS' impact in the years to come.

Shoooowee, it's hot! Summer is the season for cookouts, fireworks, and good times with friends. This is a friendly reminder to remember your pets this 4th of July.

When the temperature rises, be sure to keep yourself and your pets cool. Hydration plays a huge part in day-to-day life, especially during the summer. If your pet is spending time outdoors, provide them with a shaded area with fresh water. Watch for signs of overheating and heat stroke, such as rapid breathing, heavy panting,



excessive drooling, weakness, drowsiness, vomiting, diarrhea, or abnormally colored, dry, or sticky gums. At the end of the day, you know your pet best, so be on the lookout for anything unusual and seek medical attention if necessary.

The 4th of July is one of the biggest holidays of the summer, but it can be stressful for pets. Your home is your pet's safe space, and it's usually better if they are away from the action. Pets have better hearing than humans, so crowds, fireworks, and other loud noises can be overwhelming. Making sure your pets have a comfortable, stress-free space to spend the evening is a good idea. Regardless of their location, be sure to keep their collar with identifying tags on them throughout the holiday season in the event they happen to get lost or spooked by the celebration. Even if you didn't set off fireworks, it's important to check your yard for any fireworks debris that may have landed there.

No insulin shots needed for this gal. She currently eats a prescription diabetic diet, but continuing that or switching up her food would be between you and your vet."
